What We Do

BIKES FOR KIDS organization is made up of local volunteers that collect used bicycles, then repair them so that they will be safe to give away to people in the Loudonville-Perrysville School District. At the local fairs, we give away new bicycles as we make a connection with our communities. We also give a bright red helmet with every new or used bike.

We also present a bicycle safety program for the students in the local elementary school. We teach hand signals and safety rules and stress the importance of wearing a helmet. Our downtown bike shop is open on the first and third Saturdays from 10am-noon for bike repairs, and to accept bike applications.





How We Began

The Bikes for Kids program started in 2009 with the goal of providing children in need a bicycle for Christmas. The program has grown over the years to include repairing bikes, giving away new bikes, teaching bicycle safety, and encouraging safe riding practices.

While most of our bikes are given to children, in recent years we have also provided bikes to adults as a means of transportation to and from work or college classes or simply for recreation.

As of 2019 we have provided 1,000 bikes and helmets for the Loudonville-Perrysville area.
