3 His work is full of majesty and splendour, and his righteousness endures for ever.

4 He makes his marvellous works to be remembered;

the Lord is gracious and full of compassion.

5 He gives food to those who fear him; he is ever mindful of his covenant.

6 He has shown his people the power of his works

in giving them the lands of the nations.

7 The works of his hands are faithfulness and justice;

all his commandments are sure.

8 They stand fast for ever and ever, because they are done in truth and equity.

9 He sent redemption to his people; he commanded his covenant for ever;

holy and awesome is his name.

10 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom;

those who act accordingly have a good understanding;

his praise endures for ever.
