ANGLICAN GROW HOPE

Join us again in helping raise money for the people in Kenya



WHAT IS IT?

- Diocese of Rupert's Land ANGLICAN GROW HOPE 2025 Marsabit County Project
- It's all about **Partnerships!!** Our chance to help those facing food insecurity.
- Our donations support our **Partner** farmer, Fred Wiebe, to dedicate 40 acres of his soybean crop to Grow Hope
- Fred donates all the proceeds of these acres to our next **Partner**, Canadian Food Grains Bank (CfGB), where it goes into the Alongside Hope (formerly PWRDF) account
- When Alongside Hope withdraws the money for the Marsabit county project, the federal government becomes another **Partner**, matching the funds 3:1!

- In turn, Alongside Hope **Partners** with Church World Services (CWS) who **partner** directly with the villagers helping them to identify their strengths and building on those strengths
- These activities put money into action transforming lives in the villages
- Mary Obiero, who visited Rupert's Land 2 years ago, is the head of CWS in that region, ensuring that money is spent supporting villagers to improve their lives

WHAT IS THE PROJECT?

- Marsabit is a region in northern Kenya badly affected by drought / Droughts are happening more often and lasting longer in recent years
- Men of the village forced to move their herds in search of pasture and water, leaving women and children on their own with few resources
- Church World Services (CWS), with support from Alongside Hope, is working with village women to mitigate the effects of drought
- Mitigation actions involve developing Kitchen Gardens which are transformative for the village families, through provision of seeds and education
- Women grow traditional foods and newer foods which are drought-tolerant and plant trees to provide both fruit and shade

The funds we send provide seeds, education and staff provide assistance and CHANGE LIVES.

HOW DO WE HELP?

- *Help us raise funds to pay Fred the Farmer for his input costs \$300 per acre x the 40 acres (\$12,000) Every dollar helps / Every parish should be involved.
- * There will be special events across the Diocese to raise awareness and funds
- * Youth involvement through a Grow Hope project rolling out in August
- * Donations are made by writing a cheque payable to the Diocese of Rupert's Land with Grow Hope in the Memo line and putting it on the collection plate
- * Save your toonies and loonies to be placed in our Grow Hope Jar
