

They stopped construction on her nearly-completed home and placed unrealistic demands on her before an occupancy permit would be issued. With our attorney, we have been working with local officials to get this misjustice resolved. Although the officials gave the carpenters permission to build the house back as it was originally constructed, they changed their mind as the house neared completion. Please pray as we continue to meet with the officials that they will right the wrong that has been imposed upon this dear widow. She continues to live in a Days Inn motel while the officials busy themselves with other projects.

Return America worked diligently in several counties in recent elections to get good, conservative people in office. We were very successful, especially in changing the majority of some school boards. Some of these people have been working diligently behind the scenes, assimilating materials in preparation of making a stand in upcoming days. The evidence of pornography in a particular school has been researched and found to be prevalent and will be exposed before a monthly board meeting soon. Return America



Webster's dictionary defines a hero as a mythological or legendary figure endowed with great strength or ability, an illustrious warrior, a person admired for achievements and noble qualities, or one who shows great courage.

As I was watching a particular, well-known pastor recently, I took note of his comments concerning heroes. His words took me back to my childhood; and to what I am convinced was the experience of many young boys and girls. In our home it was clearly understood that some of the greatest stories of heroic feats were found in the works of Dickens, Melville, and Stevenson. Days and nights were spent reading of the exploits of Jim Hawkins, Oliver Twist, and a host of others. As I would read, I would be whisked away to those far off places filled with adventure and danger. The landscapes that would be painted within my mind were breathtaking and awe-inspiring.

But as is often the case, books soon gave way to another distraction. Soon athletic stars became the focus; as they still are for millions. Bedroom doors and walls became decorated with the likes of Roger Staubach and Michael Jordan. (Yes, I realize that I am showing my age.) I would plot their achievements, rejoice in their victories, and feel sadness in their losses. When those stars of the court, gridiron, or diamond finally walked away from the game they loved so much, it felt as if far more than chapters of certain books were closed; it seemed as if entire volumes were no more.

Generations of men and women, boys and girls, become fixated on the deeds of their heroes. They follow them with an intense and passionate devotion. Every game, every move, every word is analyzed and dissected. People are ready, at a moment's notice, to fight for or defend their hero against anyone that would speak the slightest word of criticism. These positions extend far beyond the endless debates as to who is the greatest (pitcher, quarterback, or guard) of all time. They cross cultures and genres. They extend into the realms of music and movies, patriots and politics. As the definition of a hero continues to be redefined by each succeeding generation (many times in ways that are not accurate) we must strive to honor the millions of unsung heroes of history. For every Alvin York, Audie Murphy, and Louis Zamperini there are dozens, if not hundreds, of men and women that never made it home to receive a heroes' welcome.

It would do all of us a great amount of good to reevaluate those that we call "heroes." With all due respect, there is nothing especially heroic about the ability to put a round ball through an iron hoop, hit a baseball 450 feet, or throw a football for over 300 yards in a single game. It is not courageous to repeat memorized lines of a script while looking photogenic. It is not a demonstration of bravery to sing the same song night after night to stadiums filled with screaming fans. But it is heroic to put your life on the line day after day to protect those that are often unthankful, just as the members of our military and law enforcement do. It is heroic to run into a burning building in an attempt to save those trapped inside, as our firefighters and emergency responders do. It is even heroic to stand against a warped secular agenda as a few of our citizens are beginning to do.

Even within Christianity we have "heroes of the faith." We often turn our attention to the endeavors of Abraham and Joseph, David and Daniel, Ruth and Esther, or Peter and Paul. As we do such, we are encouraged, we are inspired, we are challenged to live with the same faith and courage that they exhibited. When the pages turn and the canon of Scripture is closed, we find others that set our hearts ablaze. We read about William Carey and Adoniram Judson, Charles Spurgeon and D.L. Moody, Eric Liddell and Jim Elliott. We learn that while they certainly had feet of clay, they lived lives and displayed faith that we should admire and emulate.

Yet in hundreds of towns and in thousands of places throughout the world, there are men and women who are laboring heroically and serving faithfully, for the cause of Christ. Perhaps they pastor a small church in a town so tiny that it doesn't even appear on most maps. Maybe they are a faithful Christian wife and mother that works at the endless task of turning a house into a home for her husband and children. It could be that they are a missionary serving on a foreign field where it is illegal to evangelize. Their names may never be listed among the "Who's Who" of Christian heroes of the centuries. It is doubtful that their words will ever be printed in prestigious publications or repeated at celebrated conferences. In all actuality, even when they leave this world, only a few may acknowledge their passing.

Oh, but I am convinced that they will indeed receive a heroes' welcome when they reach the shores of Heaven. They will enter the gates of that city about which they had long preached and taught and sung. They will be reunited with others who had gone on before them; many that they had led to Christ. They will join the ranks of those that had loved and led and fed just as they did. And most importantly, they will see the One, THE HERO, Jesus Christ. They will see face-to-face the One that fought the forces of Satan, that bled and died, and rose again so that they, so that all that would trust in Him, could have eternal life.
