SCRIPTURE READING: Exodus 3:1-7

3 Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness and came to Mount Horeb, the mountain of God. ² There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. ³ Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight and see why the bush is not burned up." ⁴ When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." ⁵ Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." ⁶ He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. ⁷ Then the Lord said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land to a good and spacious land, to a land flowing with milk and honey.

CLOSING SONG: “Shine, Jesus Shine ”



Grounded In Creation- Week 3: Fire

Touch – Light a candle or small fire and feel the heat without pain. Fire refines—like controlled burns in nature. What might the Holy Spirit be burning away in you to reveal your true self?

Taste – Eat something roasted or baked slowly and with gratitude. Notice the warmth and the fire's role in transforming food into nourishment.

Smell – Recall the lingering scent of campfire. Reflect on memories of gathering around fire—storytelling, warmth, connection. How might you cultivate that same community today?

Hear – Listen to the crackle of a flame, or imagine it. Fire holds great power. What small act can you do today to restore balance—in creation and within?

See – Sit quietly with a candle's flame. Consider



your inner fire: is it strong and well-tended? What helps it grow, and how are you being called to share your light?
