PASTORAL CARE TEAM: Betty Nadurak

The purpose of this ministry is to help everyone feel cared for and loved as part of our Parish family. We don't want anyone to "fall through the cracks," and feel that no one knows or cares. This taking care of each other can be done informally, checking on each other. It can also be done more formally as part of the Pastoral Care Team — the ministry of human presence. Special training is available. On behalf of the congregation, the team members contact those in the parish in whatever their own circumstances, so that Jesus Christ can be present and bring healing, compassion and understanding.

It is a ministry requires someone who is willing to be present, and actively listening to the person, but not counselling. If you have a Pastoral Care need, or if you would like to learn more about becoming part of this ministry, please contact Betty or the Parish Office.
