We Listen for God's Word

SCRIPTURE READING:

Luke 8: 4-15 New International Version
While a large crowd was gathering and people
were coming to Jesus from town after town, he told
this parable: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As
he was scattering the seed, some fell along the
path; it was trampled on, and the birds ate it
up. Some fell on rocky ground, and when it came
up, the plants withered because they had no
moisture. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew
up with it and choked the plants. Still other seed fell
on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a
hundred times more than was sown."

When he said this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear."

His disciples asked him what this parable meant. He said, "The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that, "'though seeing, they may not see; though hearing, they may not understand.'

"This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. Those on the rocky ground are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away.

The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature.

But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

After this the Lord appointed seventytwo others and sent them two by two ahead of him
to every town and place where he was about to
go. He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the
workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest,
therefore, to send out workers into his harvest
field. Go! I am sending you out like lambs among
wolves. Do not take a purse or bag or sandals; and
do not greet anyone on the road.

"When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you. Stay there, eating and drinking whatever they give you, for the worker deserves his wages. Do not move around from house to house.

"When you enter a town and are welcomed, eat what is offered to you. Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, go into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town we wipe from our feet as a warning to you. Yet be sure of this: The kingdom of God has come near.'

The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name."

He replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you. However, do not rejoice that the

spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."
