No matter who you are or what you are carrying today, know you are beloved and so very welcome here.

At the AbbeyChurch, we tell stories of faith, encourage hope, share meals, care for each other and for God's creation, and strive to practice the teachings of Jesus.

We're at different places in our faith journey but we share a guiding sacred story as found in scripture (The Bible) and summarised in our Christian creeds.

We share a willingness to honestly wrestle with God–with our questions and doubts, our disillusionment with our institutions and our concern for our world.

We draw on those spiritual traditions, as well as others across the Christian spectrum. We're also connected to Emmaus, an intentional community that is inspired by monasticism and whose members make commitments to prayer, presence and simplicity.

We believe that Christ's love and grace binds our differences together and renews our hope as we gather each week at Jesus' table of radical welcome.

The Great Thanksgiving / Communion

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise**

Beloved children of God, as we gather here this morning, we respond to the words of Jesus, who tells us: "...where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." And it is in the name of Christ that we proclaim that this table is open to all people — no matter who you are or what you believe or what you've been told.

Here we remember the simple gathering of a community that came together for a meal that proclaimed a new way of being in this world. Here we remember God's radically inclusive love made real in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Here we remember the One who befriended the forgotten, embraced the outcast, and saw the Image of God in all people.

Here we remember the One who confronted every power that disconnected, marginalized, oppressed, and "other-ed." Therefore we join our voices across space and time, with every tongue, tribe and nation, with every creature of every gender, with sinners and saints of every century past and future, and with the whole company of earth and heaven to proclaim:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. +Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

It is here at this table that we find hope and imagination to see God's dream and promise of a world of wholeness, and it is here that we receive the nourishment and strength to continue on the paths of justice. We recall that on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "Take and eat. This is my body that is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup, saying, "This is my blood, my very life, poured out for you. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your life-giving Spirit upon this gathering of queer and straight, wondering and wonderful. Let the fire of your love reveal once again your rainbow of love in our lives. Bless this bread and wine that they may be for us the Body and Blood of Christ. May this bread and wine remind us that we are loved and nourished by God— fiercely and forever. And however the world may try to hold us down or tell us who to be, remind us that nothing can separate us from your divine presence. All are welcome (none compelled!) to receive at Jesus' table! The bread is gluten-free but may contain almond flour, egg and dairy. Please ask the server if you would like a non-dairy / nut option (rice crackers). The juice is in the small cups. Wine is in the larger common cup. Please refrain from dipping the bread.

Song (pre-recorded): Agnus Dei / Lamb of God - Gregorian Chant

This next communion song was penned by Rev. Marsha Stevens-Pino, often considered the mother of Christian Rock. After her coming out lesbian, this song was torn from hymnals in the 1970s onward. Marsha, an MCC minister has called it her 'coming out song' and it has become a an anthem in LGBTQ2SIA+ Christian Communities.
