
STUDY NOTES

	SCUSSION QUESTIONS	Article #4 Jesus Christ
1	HEAD (What We Learn or Believe) What do the Scriptures teach about Jesus' identity as both fully God and fully human? Why is this essential to the gospel message? Philippians 2:5–8; Colossians 2:9; Hebrews 2:14, 17 Reflect on how Christ's divinity and humanity are described, and why both are necessary for salvation.	
2	Why is it essential to believe that Jesus lived a sinless life, and how does this qualify Him to be our Saviour? 1 John 3:5; Hebrews 4:15; Romans 5:19 Consider how Christ's obedience contrasts with Adam's disobedience and what this means for us.	
3	How do the fulfilled prophecies about Jesus affirm His identity as the Messiah and support the reliability of the gospel? Luke 24:44; Isaiah 53; Micah 5:2 What do these prophecies show us about God's long-term plan, and how does that build your trust in Scripture?	
4	What role does the resurrection play in validating Jesus' identity and completing God's redemptive plan? 1 Corinthians 15:17; Romans 1:4; Acts 2:32-33 Why is the resurrection the foundation of our faith, and how does it confirm that Jesus is who He said He is?	
5	HANDS (What We Do or Practice) In conversations with friends or neighbours, how often do you speak about Jesus as both Saviour and God? How could you grow in confidence to share this truth? Colossians 1:15–20; 1 Peter 3:15 How can you prepare your heart and mind to give a reason for the hope you have in Jesus?	
6	Jesus quoted Scripture when facing temptation. What are some specific verses you can memorize to help you when you're facing struggles or temptation? Matthew 4:1-11; Psalm 119:11 Choose one verse today that speaks to a current area of struggle and commit to memorizing it this week.	
7	FEET (Where We Go or How We Live It Out) How does knowing Jesus humbled Himself and became human challenge the way you live, especially in relationships or leadership? Philippians 2:5–7; John 13:12–17 Are there areas where you need to grow in humility or servant-heartedness like Christ?	
8	Jesus now sits at the right hand of God as our advocate and high priest. How does this truth affect how you approach God in prayer and worship this week? Hebrews 4:14–16; Hebrews 10:12; Romans 8:34 What difference does it make to know Jesus is interceding for you right now?

Philippians 2:5-8

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
