KIDS CITY, NEON AND FUSION

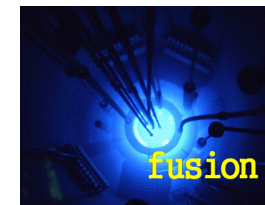
Wednesday night programming resumes August 6 at 6pm.

How can we, as RBC members, best support our church? Our contributions fund ministry expenses, outreach, salaries and building maintenance—much like caring for your own home.

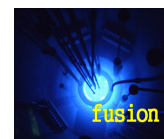
