EASTER ENIGMAS

Enigma is a fun word for mystery. When I think of a mystery, I (Jen) usually think of a detective whodunnit story. But mystery has long been used to describe paradoxical articles of faith. God has revealed them but we cannot fully wrap our heads around them. For example, Jesus was fully human and fully God. Or, how can God be ONE, and also three? We work hard to understand enigmas as best we can, but they are best appreciated with a good dose of awe and wonder, with the recognition that they might just be bigger than we can fully grasp.

This Easter season I've been pondering what is sometimes called the Divine Exchange, what Jesus exchanged with us on the cross. It started one day when I was pondering my reluctance to come into God's presence to pray. Oh, I had allowed shame to sneak in. I was feeling unworthy, stained by sins of omission and commission in areas where I was trying hard to grow. In a flash, I was reminded that Jesus took all those on Himself at the cross and that is why I am always welcome to "come boldly to the throne of grace" (Hebrews 4:16. Hebrews 1-4). Relief came with the truth of this mystery of Jesus taking my rightful punishment so I could have his deserved good standing. I can logically grasp it but I cannot fully comprehend it, let alone the amazing love that chose to do so.

The cross is a place of divine exchange. I give Him my sin. Jesus gives me his right standing with God (2 Cor 5:21). As prophesied, He was pierced and crushed for our wrongdoings. His punishment brought peace to us (Is 53:5). We often focus on this exchange in the church world but it is not all that He did on the Cross. Here are some more.



**He took our pain and bore our suffering. ByHis wounds, we healed from those as well. (Is 53:4-5) So. bring him my mourning and He gives me comfort, along with the oil of joy. (Is 61:2-3)

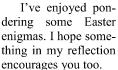
**I bring him my grief and ashes and He crowns me with beauty. ((Is 61:3)

I bring him my despair and he replaces it with a garment of praise. (Is 61:3)

**I bring him my broken heart and wounded places. He binds them up and brings healing. (Is 61:1 and many psalms as well talk about God being close to and healing the brokenhearted.)

My list does go on but my space runs out!

I find the exchange when I bring Him my pain or despair is not always immediately complete. However, burdens do lift off my heart. I am strengthened to take my next step. I feel palpably better when I pour out my heart and renew my trust in Him as the one who promises to set All things right at the Proper time. I'm grateful for such a kind and compassionate God who wants to share all good things with us.

- 29 Global workers to stay rooted in the True vine, and thus bear fruit that lasts.

- 5 mental rest.
- 6 catching up on those little tasks...or at least corralling several. Is one ever truly 'caught up?.
- 7 Western Region YWAM meetings at the end of the month to be helpful to all who attend (Craig).
- 8 planning for the 2nd half of the year..
- 9 great results on Jen's cardiology baseline. The first test is today.
- 10 finding ways to exercise despite the heat (we expect a long hot summer this year).
- 11 We thank God for a great retreat and a good end to the lectures of our life coaching course (more practical work to be done before the course is fully finished)..
- 12 creative rest.
