Grace to you and peace from God our Father.


³ In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁴ for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, ⁵ because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel ⁶ that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. ⁷ This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf, ⁸ and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

⁹ For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰ so that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. ¹¹ May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, so that you may have all endurance and patience, joyfully ¹² giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³ He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."







There are four types of study notes: 1. The World of the Bible notes which explore the historical, cultural and geographic background of a passage. 2. Biblical Concepts describe key words or themes in scripture. 3. Lutheran Perspectives highlight Lutheran theological insights and catechetical connections. 4. Faith Reflections encourage personal reflection as well as discussion with others. Bibles will be \$40, and orders are due on August 31st.

Welcome to Zion and the NOEL Cluster!

As we begin our shared journey with Zion Lutheran Church in Gasport on July 1st, here's some fun facts to know about our new siblings at Zion and the NOEL Cluster:

- Zion Lutheran Church is in Gasport, a hamlet on the Erie Canal in Niagara County. They're almost due north of us. Gasport is part of the Town of Royalton, the next town north of Tonawanda Creek from the Town of Newstead.
- Zion was founded in 1912. They have a food pantry, and hold a Vacation Bible School each August.
- Royalton Ravine Park (1 mi. away) and Becker Farms (3 mi. away) are nearby.
- What is the NOEL cluster?: NOEL stands for Niagara Orleans Evangelical Lutherans. It's an informal relationship among 5 smaller churches (now counting us!) that allows for collaboration on programs and worship opportunities. Bible Study, faith formation, special worship services and more are all possible thanks to this cluster that shares resources and pastors. The NOEL Cluster includes:
 - o Trinity, S Newstead (that's us!)
 - o Trinity, Wolcottsville (9 mi. away)
 - o Zion, Gasport (15 mi. away)
 - o St. Peter, Medina (17 mi. away)...Pr. Rick did his pastoral internship here!
 - o St. John's, Lyndonville (25 mi. away)
 - There are three pastors that are part of the NOEL cluster: Pastor Rick (here and at Zion) joins Pastor Sohail Akhtar (St. Peter) and Pastor Craig Rhodenizer (Trinity, Wolcottsville & St. John's).
