Three Reasons Paul is Writing to the Philippians

- 1. Suffering
- 2. Disunity
- 3. Opponents

Main Idea

We must stand firm in our identity with Christ so that we don't become self-righteous.

Children of God are aware of self-righteous living.



Philippians 3:1-2

Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord! It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you. Watch out for those dogs, those men who do evil, those mutilators of the flesh.

Self-righteousness: thinking your actions make you a good Christian before God.

3 Ways Paul Exposes Self-Righteous Character

Watch out for those...

- 1. Dogs
- 2. Evildoers
- 3. Mutilators of the flesh

Philippians 3:4-6

though I myself have reasons for such confidence. If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more:

circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless.
