Luke 10:25-37

(NRSV)

<sup>25</sup>Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

<sup>26</sup>He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?"

<sup>27</sup>He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

<sup>28</sup>And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

<sup>29</sup>But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

<sup>30</sup>Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead.

<sup>31</sup>Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup>So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.

<sup>33</sup>But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity.

<sup>34</sup>He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

<sup>35</sup>The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.'

<sup>36</sup>Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?"

<sup>37</sup>He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

We transition to the second section of Paul's texting as we look at his letter to the Colossians, beginning with "Heard of this Hope":

"Sometimes, the Pauline epistles feel like we're picking up in the middle of a conversation or perhaps an email thread."

I sometimes wonder what exactly the Colossians were doing that Paul was so effusive in his greeting to them. When was the last time you told someone that you constantly thank God for them, because of how they live and bear fruit of the Spirit?

Do we live in such a way that others would want to thank God for us? Do we bring the hope we have in Jesus into their lives?

It certainly sounds like the Northern kingdom of Israel under King Jeroboam was not. The Chosen People of God were supposed to be a beacon guiding everyone to know the Lord, but when God checked their status, those worshipping in Bethel were found to be askew.

Those listening to them were not being drawn nearer to God. We know that when people do not turn to God, they develop wicked and cruel tendencies. Then we get people like the psalmist, crying out to God for justice – and the Lord does take corrective action when we ask for it. Though we do not always appreciate how God answers our prayers, we can be assured that God acts for the best.

Sometimes this means that terrible things come to light, that the evil may be eradicated. Amos warned the Northern kingdom that they would be destroyed. I wonder about our country, with special interests esteemed over what Jesus taught – how long before God's justice is made known more directly here?

Amaziah rejected God's message and was condemned along with the kingdom. When the world pushes us to leave grace behind so that we may live in comfort while others do not, do we carry the message of Jesus to those oppressed or reject the message/messenger?

People get defensive and angry when God's way shows them to be unloving or lacking in grace. It can be painful to give up sinful comforts, like setting a broken bone can be painful but is necessary for healing. Getting aligned with the Lord usually requires extra effort, a change of lifestyle (like better health requires eating right/exercising more).



Jesus sought to help people improve their spiritual health, their faith, all the time. Always, He directed their focus back to God. The lawyer in today's Gospel reading seemed to be on the verge of celebrating his own accomplishments instead of serving God. After all, he knew the law and gave the right answer to Jesus's question.

But when he pushed it, Jesus redirected him to showing the mercy of God. It was the one who helped who was the neighbor. We are all residents of the same planet; God has us all as neighbors to one another. Are we treating one another as God would have us act toward our neighbor?

The Lord knows we are sinful and make mistakes. But we have heard of this hope in Jesus, that even after everything, God loves us and invites us to better.

Paul Washer tweeted in 2013, "I have given God countless reasons not to love me. None of them has been strong enough to change Him."<sup>1</sup>
