Beloved people of Arnolia,

It's an honor and privilege for me to be beginning my second year here. Arnolia truly is a lovely community, and I'm excited to see where God takes us. As a gathered and growing community of Jesus followers, we have made a significant spiritual impact this year. We've celebrated a baptism and received two new members who made their first public professions of faith in joining Arnolia, with more to come this summer. Throughout the first five months of 2025, we have averaged 40 weekly attendees at worship, with 5 joining us online live and an average of 37 views of our livestreams. We also have two people calling in to hear our worship recording. Our weekly pastor's study has had 13 participants so far this year. We've run Arnolia 101 twice already this year. Our newer visitors have testified to the loving environment and sense of belonging they felt at Arnolia.

We have also worked hard to connect to our communal neighbors through various ministries. This spring, we hosted our largest flea market fundraiser, raising over \$4,700 thanks to the efforts of many volunteers. The thrift store, supported by numerous volunteers, serves hundreds of community members and has raised nearly \$20,000 for our ministries and community partners in the first five months of the year. Since Holy Week, we've been receiving prayer requests through the thrift store, and so far, we've received requests from over 10 community

members. The faithful stewardship of our building has helped provide affordable before- and after-school care for children through Active Minds and affordable preschool through Woodhome. This summer, they both have summer programs hosted here at Arnolia, and this fall, Woodhome is expecting to welcome its largest cohort since 2020. While we do have space use agreements with each of them, your generosity helps maintain the building and keep the space use rates relatively low for both of our educational partners. We continue to make monthly donations to ACTC to help purchase food for their food pantry. At Oakleigh Elementary, we have equipped thirteen children with a bag of food every week of the school year through our backpack buddies ministry. We were invited to their end-of-year festival and received prayers from over 20 families, as well as shared community resources. We are also now the official non-profit sponsor for the food pantry at Oakleigh, enabling them to obtain food at a lower cost through the MD Food Bank. And to top it all off, we have sent at least three Cadillacs full of items received and collected for Helping Up Mission so far this year.

So far this year, our income (\$127,940.64) has almost kept up with our expenses (\$128,206.53) as the summer slump in giving has arrived. We celebrate that giving from Arnolia community members has increased by 8.6%, thanks to five brand-new givers and 63% of active givers, who have increased their generosity. The collective generosity of all of you has enabled us to support our ministries and ministerial partners with over \$14,000 (approximately 10% of our expenses), dedicated to ministries beyond Arnolia through direct contributions and the faithful giving of our Mission Shares to the Baltimore-Washington Conference.

This year, the leadership team finalized our values and adopted the new vision from the United Methodist Church (UMC) as our own. As a community of faith at Arnolia United Methodist Church, we are committed to living out our faith and embodying God's love through community, discipleship, evangelism, generous hospitality, inclusivity, justice, & prayer. Our vision is that we form disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously. I'm excited for all that we will continue to do as we follow Jesus, grow disciples, and serve others here in Parkville, MD and beyond.

"BUILDING COMMUNITY: A THIRD SPACE INITIATIVE"

Greetings,

In light of our values and vision, we have a big dream for the coming years, and we'd like to offer you the opportunity to partner with us. Our big dream is to continue doing the great work we are already doing while establishing ourselves further as a third space within our community where we can connect with our neighbors more intentionally. (A third space is a space where people connect outside of their home, work, or school.) Our building is already linked to our surrounding community most days of the week, including many Saturdays throughout the year. As a result, we'd like to see how we can better open ourselves to love, serve, and lead within our neighborhood. As a leadership team, we have identified three specific needs to invest in becoming a third space.

First, our kitchen is commercially licensed and presently has one cook who uses our kitchen once a week. Over the past few months, our current commercial stoves and ovens have proven themselves to be unreliable. Thus, to serve our present community partner faithfully, our stoves and ovens need an immediate upgrade. We have contracted out the removal, disposal, and replacement of our stoves and ovens with a new set that is more efficient and easier to maintain than our old one. This upgrade will also enable us to connect with one to two other local chefs who would need to utilize our kitchen or potentially host more food-based ministries out of our kitchen in the future.

Second, to expand our ability to host educational and other community events while also enriching our Sunday morning worship experience and increasing accessibility, we need to upgrade or replace our projector system. After receiving multiple quotes from local businesses, we plan to purchase two large-screen TVs for the front left and right of the sanctuary and install them ourselves, which will help reduce the cost.

Lastly, with the age of our gathered community and the dream of serving more people in our surrounding neighborhood, the team has identified the need for an emergency station to be available. While we presently have basic first aid supplies, we hope to expand them to include an automated external defibrillator (AED), which uses auditory instructions to walk the user through helping someone experiencing sudden cardiac arrest through electric shock.

In total, we plan to conduct a brief capital campaign to equip Arnolia to be a third space by raising \$15,000 beyond our regular giving and fundraising efforts. We invite you to join us in whatever way you can. Could we count on your intentional investment in the expansion of communal presence where we can connect with our surrounding neighbors to love boldly, serve

joyfully, and lead courageously? We hope that you can invest in this initiative in one or more ways:

- Be in prayer for our community as we undertake this capital campaign and foster new connections with our neighbors.
- Be present in our worship, ministry, and fundraising efforts in whatever manner you find best for you at this time.
- Share with Arnolia your generosity by giving to this campaign in addition to the generous giving you already do
- Join our leadership team in recruiting community partners who may be interested in supporting our vision of becoming a third space for Parkville residents.
- Bear witness to the dreams, values, and vision of your beloved Arnolia by sending in your testimony about why you love and support Arnolia. You can send in your testimony to Rev. Yost or coordinate a time when you can record a video testimony with Rev. Yost.

To have some fun this summer with our capital campaign fundraiser, July and August will be our Arnoila Third Space: Beard or No Beard competition. We will have two jars in the sanctuary to donate to the Arnolia Third Space campaign. Your donation into the Beard Jar or the No Beard Jar will determine if Rev. Yost will keep their beard in September or shave it off. You will also be able to share this fundraiser through social media and with your friends and family.
