Some clarifying questions we were asked, and I ask you to consider include:

Who could my church begin building relationships with?

Are there any people within my church or community that I label as "them"?

How do we increase our understanding of one another?

How might worship, fellowship, or small groups need to change to create space for those who are not already part of our community? *

Take some time to consider this core value and what it means or how it might look, or even how it DOES look here in Decorah. Talk to each other. Let ideas flow and fly. Let us live into this core value together. Welcome to July. The first half of the year 2025 is behind us and the future is before.

Last month was the Annual Conference in Iowa. While there, we were introduced to the core values that came out of the town hall meetings across Iowa last year with the bishop and her team. These are values that arose in conversations across the state that we as United Methodists strive to live into and that we United Methodists across the state have stated are who we are. There are six total core values for our conference that came out of those conversations. I would like to share one a month for the rest of the year with you along with the questions we were asked to discuss at our tables during the conference.

The first core value is Belonging and building relationships. "We nurture belonging by emphasizing the importance of building relationships rooted in love and shared faith within a supportive Christian community." If we look at this through the Wesleyan quadrilateral we see support for this core value.

Scripture: Ephesians 4:1-6 "... Conduct yourselves with all humility, gentleness, and patience. Accept each other with love and make an effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit with the peace that ties you together. You are one body and one spirit, just as God also called you in one hope..."

Tradition: "[Jesus] commands us to 'build up one another." ... [A]ccording to the judgment of our Lord and the writings of his apostles, it is only when we are 'knit together' that we 'have nourishment from him', and 'increase with the increase of God'."

- John Wesley New Testament Notes on 1 Cor 15:47

Reason: We know that individual humans have varying talents or ways of functioning. We also know that social groups tend to cluster into "we" and "they." However, God designed us to need one another and calls us to break down barriers and fears to live as one Body of Christ.

Experience: The connection between Immanuel UMC and Immanuel Gospel Fellowship started as a simple space sharing arrangement when IGF needed a new place to call home. Over time, relationships began to form that led to IGF members formally joining the UMC and support for six individuals becoming candidates **for** ministry.

Treasurer's Corner

Hot enough for you yet? It's Iowa remember... 🙂

So, for July we're going to call this "Directionally Correct" since I need to publish this before our last week of deposits and billing (mostly salaries). The numbers presented here are only the actual numbers I have so far for the month of June:

- Income is currently at \$15K out of a plan of \$17K; recall that we had a late May deposit that drove much higher than expected income for that month, so we're probably seeing an "offset" this month.
- Expenses are currently at \$14K out of a plan of 19K. Even with our "average" outstanding salary amounts, we should come in under the \$19K budgeted amount...fingers crossed.
- The year-end operational cash position has now lifted above the \$30K level (easily seen in the chart below). This is a very welcome situation!



Here is the supporting Chart:

Notice the large income over-delivery in May and what appears to be a corresponding "offset" in June...however, the net effect is still extremely positive! The forecasted trends are pretty much the same as what we have been calling all year.

This positive outcome allowed us to avoid having to tap into the Trustees' "stop-gap" apportionment funding once again...and as I mentioned last month, if these positive trends continue, we should be able to avoid needing those dollars in the future.

Now that summer is upon us, I'm guessing that some of you would like to know how our solar panels are performing...well I do track the monthly savings, so here is our current YTD results: (see next page)
