Greetings, Dear Sisters in Christ,

We have an informative and educationally planned time with three break-out speakers and our key note speaker, Jennifer Hockenbery, who is the Interim Executive Director of the Women of the ELCA. BOLD WOMEN'S DAY—CHICKEN POT PIE!

Bold Women's Day-observed the first Sunday of March- celebrates all Lutheran women who have acted or are acting boldly on their faith in Jesus Christ. Some women are bold in their unceasing prayers. Other women are bold in their service to those in need. Still other women are bold in their advocacy or through their hospitality. Whether we live out our bold story of faith in the workplace, family home or community, our faith compels us to make a difference in the lives of others. It's all about living out our baptismal call, about being a disciple of Christ.

For the past three years, in recognition of hospitality on Bold Women Sunday, the WELCA ladies of St. Pauli Lutheran Church in rural Thief River Falls have made a supper for people in the neighborhood around Valentine's Day – those who live alone or have experienced a health issue. The first two years we made chicken dumpling soup. This year,

for a change of pace, we opted for chicken pot pie.

The ladies began cutting up precooked chicken, chopping, shredding, dicing and stirring vegetables at 10:00 am. We had three batches going – and discovered that the large burner on one of the stoves had burned out. (This has subsequently been repaired – whew!) After lunch, it was time to fill the individual containers, roll out the puff pastry, fit a piece on each top, and pop them into the ovens. We also made fresh garlic toast and rounded out the meals with homemade cookies, candy and a Valentine's Day card made by our Sunday School children.

We began boxing at 3:00 and then divided ourselves into four teams who drove around the country delivering boxes to 18 households. Eleven of these were single packages and eight were for two persons, a total of 27 pot pies. We also made pies for each of the cooks to bring home for their own suppers.

A Note from the Editor

When I was on the Executive Board, I had the opportunity to travel to many Synodical Conventions. One of them I attended was the Rocky Mountain Synod. During lunch, I asked the women at the table, "What can we do to bring in the younger generation, what appeals to them?" One of the women at the table, who was just elected to their synodical board shared what was working for her church group.

They meet once a month at 5:30 pm on their way home from work for 1 hour to have a short devotion, and work on a project, like collecting non perishable items for the food shelf, or collecting items for LWR Kits and putting them together. At 6:30, those who would like to continue with fellowship meet at a restaurant for supper.

The idea is to get women who can commit to 1 hour of their time each month to do a project of the group's choosing. No long meetings or programs, just fellowship while working on a project either for the community or beyond.

Selection Criteria:

- The woman has never attended a SWO Convention.
- Complete the question below of why you would like to attend the convention.
- Each congregational unit can have only one applicant.
 More can apply, but we are limited to only 10 scholarships.
- The woman may or may not serve as a voting delegate, but is encouraged to attend the business meeting, as a learning experience.

Selection Procedure:

- All applications should be sent to the address below and a committee, appointed by the SWO President, comprised of board members, will review each application.
- All applications are due one month prior to the convention.
- The applicants who are chosen, based on the above criteria, will receive a phone call and letter informing her of the scholarship.
