Biblical Principles for Time Management

Introduction:

- Begin with a prayer for guidance and understanding.
- Share your reasons for wanting to study time management from a biblical perspective.
- Emphasize the importance of using time wisely to serve God and others.

Scripture:

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 NIV

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

- Read and discuss this well-known passage about the seasons of life.
- How does it relate to time management?

Bible Study Questions:

1. Prioritizing God's Kingdom (Matthew 6:33)

- What does it mean to "seek first the kingdom of God" in the context of time management?
- How can we ensure that God's priorities come first in our schedules?
- 2. Redeeming the Time (Ephesians 5:15-16)
 - What does it mean to "redeem the time" or make the most of every opportunity?
 - How can we avoid wasting time on unproductive or harmful activities?
- 3. Balancing Work and Rest (Exodus 20:8-11)
 - How does the concept of the Sabbath relate to time management?
 - Discuss the importance of setting aside time for rest and worship.

4. Planning and Goal Setting (Proverbs 16:3)

- How can we commit our plans to the Lord in our daily lives?
- Share practical tips for setting goals and managing time effectively.
- 5. Overcoming Busyness (Luke 10:38-42)
 - Explore the story of Mary and Martha. What can we learn about busyness and priorities?
 - How can we strike a balance between serving and spending time with God?

6. Stewardship of Time (1 Corinthians 4:2)

- Discuss the concept of stewardship in managing our time. How are we held accountable?
- Share examples of using time wisely for God's purposes.

Application:

• Encourage participants to reflect on their current time management practices.

 Ask them to set specific goals for improving time management in line with biblical principles.

Prayer:

 Close with a prayer, asking for God's guidance and strength to manage time wisely and serve Him effectively.

Conclusion:

- Emphasize the importance of ongoing self-reflection and prayer in time management.
- Encourage participants to support one another in their journey to apply these biblical principles.

Remember that effective time management is a tool to help you live a more purposeful and God-honoring life. This Bible study can help you and others in your group explore this concept from a biblical perspective.
