Founded by German immigrants in 1745, St. John's Lutheran Church is one of the oldest congregations in the North Carolina Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We are part of a rich heritage that now spans 184 congregations and 45,000 Lutherans in North Carolina, nearly 3 million ELCA members across 65 synods in the United States, and a global communion of 78 million Lutherans through the Lutheran World Federation.

From a humble meetinghouse in 1745 to our place in the global body of Christ, St. John's continues to share God's love far beyond our own walls, living into the promise of the communion of saints.

- * Today is the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost. The Season after Pentecost (the long, green season also commonly known as Ordinary Time) begins Trinity Sunday and ends on Christ the King Sunday, the final Sunday of the church calendar year. This year, it will be November 23, 2025. This season focuses on discipleship and the teachings of Jesus. Our Gospel texts come from Luke.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MATT HANSEN

People of St. John's:

There's a moment in this week's Gospel that feels all too familiar: a flurry of things to do, the mental list growing longer, and the feeling that someone else isn't pulling their weight. Martha is doing everything she can to make Jesus feel welcome. She's got the Son of God in her house, after all! And Mary? She's just sitting there, hanging with the houseguest instead of getting things ready.



It's easy to side with Martha. After all, much of the world depends on people like her; those who are organized, capable, attentive to every detail. I think we have more than one at St. John's (I won't name names)

But Jesus gently reminds us that presence is more important than performance. "Mary has chosen the better part," he says, not to shame Martha, but to call her back to the one thing actually necessary: God in their midst.

At St. John's, many of us carry Martha's responsibilities. Those who are constantly running around, preparing meals and helping others. These acts of service are holy. But they are not the *only* holy thing. Sometimes the holiest thing is mere presence. Being in the presence of God at church. Being present with a loved one when they are going through something difficult. Being present, not offering solutions, not working to solve everything. Just being there.

Today's Gospel reminds us that discipleship is not always about doing more. Sometimes it's about stopping, breathing, and choosing the "better part." That is why we worship together Sunday morning. We are gathered from all the busyness of our day-to-day lives to be in the presence of the Living God, renewed by Word and Sacrament. But we're not left there, we don't remain at the feet of Jesus. Renewed by the gift of community, of Christ's presence, we are then sent, and ready to share God's love. But that doesn't mean we should just go, go, go. We need room for both...for serving and for sitting, for doing and for being. For seeing God at work.

You may be sitting while your neighbor may be serving. Or maybe the opposite. We don't need to police each other. Instead, we can give thanks to God for the joy and opportunity to do both.


CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

FIRST READING: GENESIS 18:1-10a

A reading from Genesis.

¹ The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. ² He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them and bowed down to the ground. ³ He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. ⁴ Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. ⁵ Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." ⁶ And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." ⁷ Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. ⁸ Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared and set it before them, and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

⁹ They said to him, "Where is your wife Sarah?" And he said, "There, in the tent." ^{10a} Then one said, "I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son."

A reading from Colossians.


¹⁵ [Christ Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, ¹⁶ for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷ He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸ He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹ For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰ and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

²¹ And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, ²² he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him, ²³ provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a minister of this gospel.

²⁴I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. ²⁵I became its minister according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, ²⁶ the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. ²⁷To them God chose to make known how great among the gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. ²⁸ It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.


GOSPEL: LUKE 10:38-42



POST COMMUNION PRAYER


