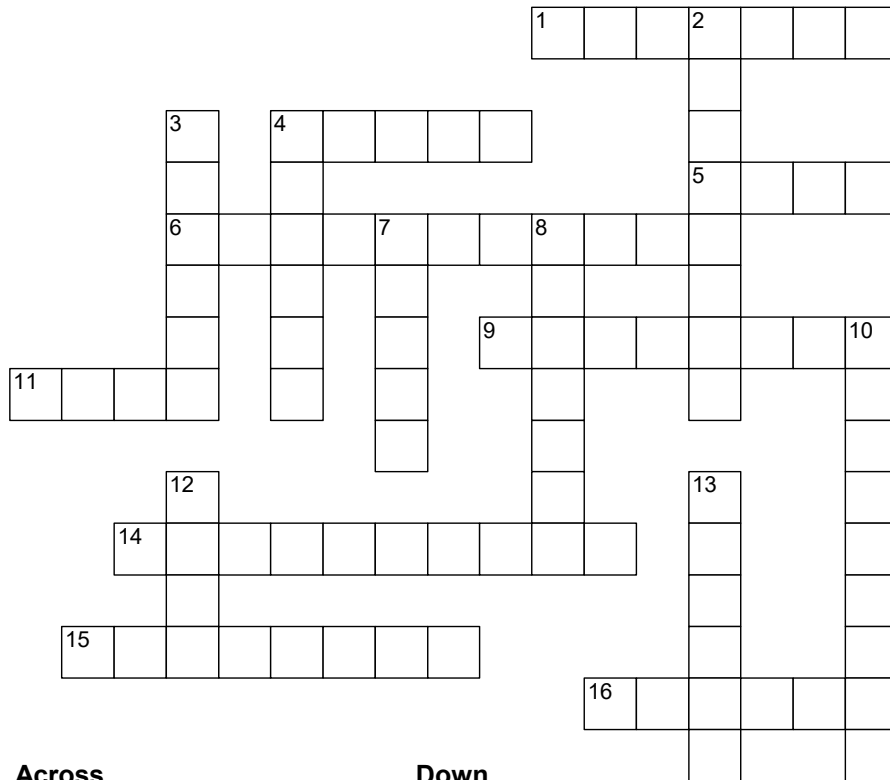


The End of Greed
