Affirmation of Faith: The Nicene Creed

# Temporary Pastoral Support Update

We're grateful that Rev. Eric will be providing part-time pastoral support to our parish over the coming months as we continue the search for our next Priest-in-Charge. This is a temporary arrangement, and Eric will be serving within his existing part-time hours. In this time, Eric will:

- Preach and preside at our Sunday morning Eucharist services, supported by our wonderful lay preaching team
- Lead weekly staff meetings
- Provide emergency pastoral care and visitation (contact details are in the bulletin)
- Officiate funerals, memorials, and other sacramental needs as they arise, outside of Sunday services

Should the search process extend beyond August and we remain without a Priest-in-Charge, and we will revisit this arrangement in consultation with the Bishop.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support during this time of transition.

# Piano Purchase

St. Paul's had a time-sensitive opportunity to purchase a beautiful (used) Yamaha C-3 baby grand piano for use in the Sanctuary. Vestry has approved the purchase and budgeted a maximum of \$15,000 for the purchase and minor maintenance work required. If you are interested in making a contribution toward this project, please mark it as "piano project". We are blessed to have a private donor willing to cover any gaps in fundraising. The piano has arrived at the technician's shop where it will be worked on over the summer. Once repairs are complete, it will be moved to St. Paul's.


