# REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

At the house of Martha and Mary another hospitality scene unfolds, and the two women take different approaches. Martha fusses over serving their guest. Mary eschews serving to be near their guest. Based on the picture of hospitality suggested in today's prior readings, it would seem that Martha's service-to-the-point-of-suffering should be praiseworthy. Martha's pained care for Jesus seems to match the biblical view of hospitality. Yet, when she expresses concern, Jesus says Mary is in the right, even though Mary is not burdening herself with service. What's happening here?

A couple of points merit notice. First, Martha's service is not joyous. She gives while counting the cost rather than with abandon. By contrast, Abraham, Sarah, and Paul give freely and joyously. Second, Martha "unloads" her burden on Jesus rather than confronting Mary with her concerns. Thus, the sisters' guest, Jesus, is thrown into the middle of a family squabble and made to negotiate it. The result is increased suffering. As any traveler will recognize, having to negotiate the conflicts of others after a trip of any length is undesirable to say the least. To be a guest is to hope for rest and peace. Thus, hallmarks of biblical hospitality are clarified. Guest and travelers merit peace, rest, good company, and anything that might mitigate their suffering. Martha, in this reading, provides a counter model. Her behavior should cause us to look beyond our personal suffering to see and receive Jesus in others and to find joy in alleviating whatever hardships they may have.

### **SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS:** 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

The Mass readings for this Sunday include stories of hospitality, service, and devotion. These readings offer important lessons on how we can live out our faith in everyday life.

- Hospitality to Strangers: In the first reading, Abraham welcomes three visitors. This shows the importance of being open and welcoming to others.
- Service and Work: The Gospel tells the story of Martha and Mary. Martha's busy work and Mary's attentive listening show different ways to serve Jesus.
- Suffering for the Faith: In Colossians 1:24-28, Paul talks about rejoicing in his sufferings. This teaches us that enduring hardships can strengthen our faith.
- Listening to Jesus: Mary sits at Jesus' feet in the Gospel. This highlights the importance of taking time to listen to Jesus' teachings.
- God's Promise: Genesis 18:1-10 includes God's promise to Abraham about having a son. This reminds us that God keeps His promises.
- ٠ Balance of Work and Prayer: Martha and Mary show the need to balance work and prayer. Both are important in our faith journey.
- Mystery of Christ: The second reading speaks of the ٠ mystery of Christ. Understanding this mystery helps deepen our faith.

These themes from the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C remind us of the different ways we can live out our faith. By welcoming others, serving, listening, and trusting in God's promises, we grow closer to Jesus.
