It is a table of communion with the earth.

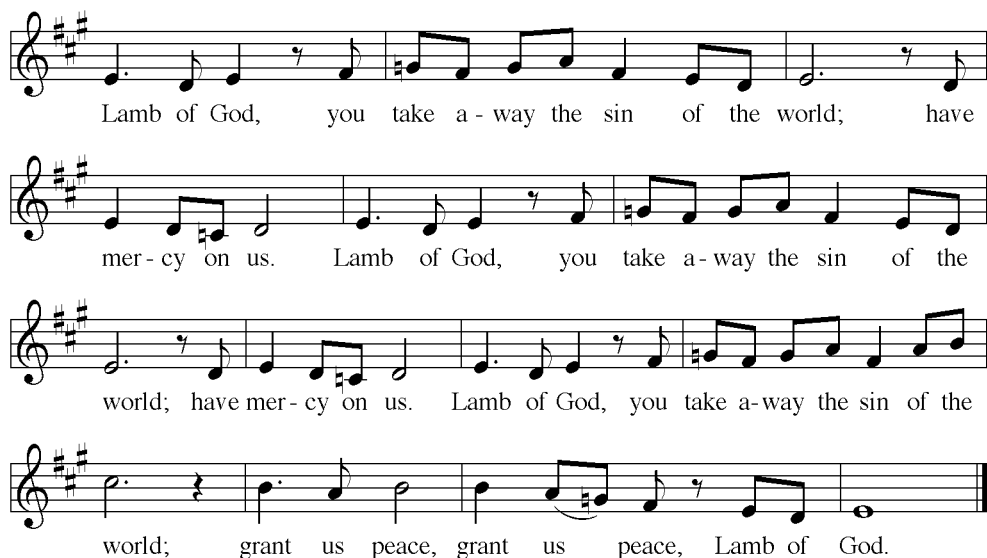
So, come those of you who have great faith and those of you who wish you had more.






