House on the Rock Parable

The house didn't fall down, though, because the smart person had built it on a sturdy rock!!



Let's Do A Craft!!





You will need. A flat rock, bag of sand, small wooden blocks, glue, stir sticks or popsicle sticks. The base could be like a cake pan. Draw two houses on cardboard and colour them in. They do not have to be the same. Glue a popsicle stick on the back sticking out the bottom about 3 inches. Pour the sand into a cake pan (with mother's permission.) On one half, add 2 or more large stones. Secure the popsicle stick houses, one between the stones and other in the sand pile.

Add a rain storm and see which one stays standing.

On white cardboard draw a similar house. To fit all the words from the bible, you will need to use a ruler to make 12 spaces.

Jesus/said/Be/wise/and/build/your/house/on/the/Rock. / Matthew 7:24.

The rock base is made with a piece of gray construction paper. Fold it in half and glue the sides together. This will make a pouch to hold the puzzle pieces.

Add different shades of gray lines using gray crayons, pencils, markers etc.
