Offering benefits to bribe someone



Positional Power
Using a position of authority to exert power



Coercive Power:
Using punishment or
force to exercise power



Expert Power: Using access to

knowledge or expertise to keep power

5 Types of Power (cont.)



Referent Power

"The ability to influence others based on personal qualities that inspire admiration, respect, and trust, rather than through formal authority or expertise. It stems from the connection a person builds with others, making them want to follow or emulate the leader."

John 18 (NLT)
