Dear Friends,

Jesus gave us two great commandments: "Love God with all your heart, soul, and mind," and "Love your neighbor as *you love* yourself" (italics added, Matthew 22:37-39). I like to think of that second commandment as a beautiful blueprint for **self-care**.

Pastors are often reminded to care for themselves. It's easy to set aside our own well-being when we're deeply committed to ministry, yet it's absolutely essential for a journey that is both sustainable and fulfilling. Ministry, after all, is a marathon, not a sprint. While we can prepare for busy seasons such as **Advent and Lent**, unexpected demands—like **funerals**, **community crises**, **or conflicts**—will inevitably arise, often requiring more energy than we have in reserve.

At our church, we believe that **everyone is a minister**, as stated on the back of our Sunday bulletin: "Ministers: The Congregation." This means self-care applies to everyone, as we all share in the ministry of our church.


