The book of Revelation ~ from Pastor Lara

Revelation is, arguably, the one book in the Bible that provokes a strong reaction from everyone. Some people are so scared of it that they've never read it. Some believe it's a prediction of the end times. Some think it's the vision of a wild fantasy and doesn't mean anything. Some have used it as a weapon to traumatize people, and have misused it in pop culture. So, it's important that we take an honest look at what Revelation is and what it is not, especially in the Lutheran context.

The full title of the book is *The Revelation to John* (who was not the author of the gospel according to John), and it's also sometimes called *The Apocalypse*. But by definition, an apocalypse is simply a revelation or disclosure.

In this 5-week series, we will explore both the scary images and the ones of pure promise and hope. We will learn that we, today, were not the intended audience. As such, we will discover that we can't assume to understand all of the symbolism and allegory in the readings. This book was written by a pastor to his congregation, a vulnerable group of people, to give them encouragement and hope in a time of great persecution. It provides an example of how the early church critiqued empire and what they understood God's liberating alternative to be.

Each of these readings will be paired with teachings of Jesus from John's gospel. Together, they will provide a deeper understanding of the early Christian church, the trials they faced, and the hope upon which their faith in Jesus rested.

Help with Bible Study – As part of our Adult Education/forum program, we will hold a monthly Bible Study at 9 a.m. the second Sunday of the month. **Leaders needed**. *We will supply the materials*.

Brunch Bunch: Yep! What could be better than a taco bar or a church potluck or a bowl of hearty soup after worship? We started the Brunch Bunch meals in 2024 and people loved them! We plan to continue them for 2025-26 but always need help. Shift choices are set up (8:15 to 10 a.m.), serving (11 am to noon) and clean-up (noon to 12:30 p.m.) Dates for the fall are: September 14, October 12, November 9 and December 14.

Tiny House Recap: On July 3, 2025 our crew of 38 volunteers from six different congregations completed another tiny house for the Low Income Housing Institute (LIHI). This is the second completed build for the East King County Conference (including Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church and Sammamish Hills) and the third for Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church. The tiny house will later be placed in one of LIHI's tiny house villages.



I will say that I am incredibly proud of the work that was done by all the youth and adult volunteers over the two weeks of the build. Approximately 900 hours were volunteered over the two weeks to not only complete the building of the tiny home, but a number of other volunteer and service projects including: building a stone walking path for the preschool at Mt. Si Lutheran Church; putting together backpack supplies for students in need in the Snoqualmie Valley School District; making tie blankets for the humane society; as well assorting VBS supplies and creating VBS decorations for the shared VBS between Mt. Si, Sammamish Hills, and St. Luke's Lutheran Churches.

It was incredible to see the youth and adults working side by side, learning and sharing together through all these projects. Everyone who came and participated shared in the work of building the house and blessed the house with their involvement. Each year, as is tradition, we vote to name the house and this year our group named our house, "Nessie." We also wrote blessings on the inside of the walls of the home, to ensure that each person who lives within the walls will be surround with warmth and love.

A huge thank you goes out to each and every person that helped with this project, without your hard work and dedication we wouldn't be able to share in these opportunities. Corner of Blessing - Food of the Month - July hopelink

Hopelink has asked us to collect **cereal** for July. With kids out of school, their customers are looking for this and cereal is not often donated. When they purchase cereal, they don't get much variety. So, toss a couple of boxes in your shopping cart - they really appreciate it when we collect cereal.

So, for July we will be collecting:

- Boxes of Cold cereal*
- Oatmeal regular (~18 ounce) or instant (6 10 count)

*(Note: Costco packaging with two boxes taped/glued together that can be separated into two boxes are OK, but NOT the single box with two bags inside. They can't be separated in their market.)









Food of the Month - August

Hopelink has asked us to collect **baby food and wipes** during August. These are items that families with very young ones really need but are hard for the food bank to get. Their current supply is incredibly low and the need has been increasing.

So, for August we will be collecting:

- Baby food* (any kind)
- Baby wipes







*(Note: Check the expiration dates. Hopelink is legally required to throw away any expired baby food or formula.)

KidVantage needs toys and books and games – because the children who utilize those services have birthdays all year!! What's on the list:

Lantern Hill utilizes our **donated funds** for everything from meals to tutition! **ALL YOUR DOLLARS** count.


- \$10 = 10 meals for a student
- \$15 = a bus pass for one week
- \$25 = a teacher's salary or a student uniform
- \$40 = ink for a printer
- \$50 = water for a week
- \$100 = three weeks of electricity costs
- \$250 = one month's rent of the two properties
- \$350 = a laptop computer
- \$500 = university tuition for one student




ELCC (Eastside Lutheran Church Community) churches, the Synod and the ELCA:
