

From Pastor Dave The Eighth Month and More

August – the last month of summer; the first month of school.

August – declared to be a month in honor of Caesar Augustus, and just before Jesus was born. If they had only waited a few more years the calendar naming committee could have called the 8th month "Jesus" or just "Jes" leaving off the "us" like August does.

The 8^{th} month – a month of declaring victory in war for armies of Augustus' day; for harvesting summer crops; for preparing 9^{th} month celebrations and thanksgivings!

The number 8 – the day Jewish baby boys, including Jesus, are circumcised and named (Luke 2); the number of Noah's family that would help God re-populate humanity; the 8th day (7 days in a week plus the next) that always starts a new week as the new 1st day, the day of the Resurrection; and thus we baptize new Christians often using the 8-sided font – a new day, a new life, from death to life, from old to new!

Report for 2nd Quarter, 2025

Dear St. Mark's Rock-clingers, singers and givers,

We sang the hymn listed above this past Sunday, July 20. I learned this song, prior to it being in a Lutheran hymnal, while at Camp Lutheridge in the 1980's from a guitar playing pastor. It holds special meaning to me. Then about 2005, after singing it as the last hymn in church one Sunday, Chris walked out with tears in his eyes. He said he learned this hymn in his Baptist church where he grew up and he played it on his fiddle. The tears – because his dear departed mother had him, her only child, play "how can I keep from singing?" on his fiddle at her funeral.

Earlier this year you and I helped provide some financial gifts and pledges to Camp Lutheridge. **Thank you!** Throughout this year you and I have given offerings of money and music and food and love – for God and neighbor including to St. Mark's General Fund and to World Hunger, Disaster Relief, Food for Days, Hands On, Memorials and more! **Thank you!**

Through June 30, St. Mark's Total Giving (and other income via interest, etc) was \$284,916.45, against the $\frac{1}{2}$ year Budget of \$287,500. Expenses through June were \$270,008.

However, please note 1): the \$14,900 surplus of giving above expenses includes A) some early year large donations which are not necessarily recurring in the last 6 months of the year; AND B) unrealized expenses thus far in 2025.

Please note 2): that in June, EXPENSES EXCEDED GIVING by \$10,750! That is obviously not sustainable! Two Sundays ago, a generous steward showed me their offering envelope *(please don't do feel like you need to do that!*). They told me they were giving a stock donation, partly to St. Mark's and partly to Camp Lutheridge! **Their gift and example is a great model for us all!**
