# WHO WE ARE

### TROY CHURCH IS A FAMILY IN JESUS

We see our church as a family. Instead of sharing a bloodline or last name, we share in our identity in Jesus (Rom. 12:5). In his name, we learn from, care for, and walk with one another in love (Eph. 5:1-2).

# WHERE WE ARE GOING

## A CHURCH FAMILY THAT LOVES LIKE JESUS AND LOOKS LIKE TROY.

We see our city as uniquely diverse: factories and farms, locals and internationals, small business and big industry. Troy is a small town that is home to many nations. We believe God would receive much glory in a church family that bore the socio-economic diversity of our city while walking in the Way of Jesus (Rev. 7:9-10).

# WHAT WE DO

1. **LOVE GOD:** We are to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, and mind. We do not love or worship Him from a distance but rather in the context of a relationship. We love Him by worshiping Him – celebrating and acknowledging who He is and what He's done. We love Him by knowing Him and being known by Him in a relationship through Jesus (Rom. 5:1-2). We shepherd towards this through two primary means:

**INDIVIDUAL WORSHIP:** We have access to God in Jesus (Eph 2:18). We can enjoy this access through personal fellowship with God in committed times of devotion and fellowship throughout our day. We worship Him through this while growing in relationship with him. We shepherd our Troy Church Family towards knowing how to spend time with God alone (Matthew 6:6).

<u>CORPORATE WORSHIP:</u> God has also called us to meet together to worship him in corporate gatherings (Acts 2:42-47, Col 3:16). We meet to sing true things about God together. We meet to be taught together. We meet to pray together. We meet to remember together, and so much more. Much of God's work and revelation of himself is delivered to us through our gathering together. We shepherd our Troy Church Family towards knowing how to spend time with God together.

2. LOVE ONE ANOTHER: We are called to love one another as a church family (John 13:34). We spend time together, share meals together, share happy times together, share hardships together, lead one another, and care for one another. We do this with people like us and not like us in celebration of the diversity God teaches us through. We cultivate loving, God-worshiping relationships through two primary means:

**SHEPHERDING:** The Bible uses a picture of a shepherd and sheep to explain the love of Jesus for us. We see Jesus give the church elders, who, alongside other leaders, get to shepherd under Christ with that same care. Elders commit to prioritize praying for, encouraging, training, and teaching our church family, while the church commits to interact with this shepherding to the glory of Jesus (1 Peter 5:1-5).

**GROUPS:** Groups serve as places where relationships form and deepen in a way that shows Jesus. These may be "Small Groups," "D-Groups," or even informal groups of friends that support life in Jesus together. These groups may or may not be open/closed, multi-generation/for a specific age, or co-ed/gender-specific. Different people with different needs in different seasons participate in these groups in different ways. All in all, we want the church family to know and be known by one another in love (Eph. 4:16).

3. LOVE THE WORLD: God has called us to serve outside of the body, into our community, and to the ends of the earth. We love the world when we take the gospel forward in missions. We love the world through worship: using our gifts and proclaiming the gospel message, so more will know and worship God. We earn the right to share through forming relationships. We care for all peoples as those who bear the image of God (Gen. 1:26). We love them as they are while praying they would know Jesus. We work towards this through three primary means:

<u>COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:</u> We aim to be a family in a city. We meet needs in our city. We want our city to be able to say they would miss us if we were gone. We serve our city, schools, families, churches, and businesses in creative ways to the glory of God (Matt. 20:28). We serve the poor, the orphan, and widow as those who were all those things spiritually before we knew Jesus (2 Cor. 9:7-9).

**PERSONAL EVANGELISM:** We engage in prayer and gospel sharing in the context of relationships. We shepherd our church family to approach every sphere of life, asking if the people God has placed them around know and walk with Jesus (2 Cor. 5:20).

FOREIGN/DOMESTIC MISSIONS: We aim to love Christians outside of Troy Church because they are still our brother and sister in Christ. We seek out partnerships with churches and missionaries far from Troy as God leads. We pray for God to raise up members of our family to go far and wide to the glory of Jesus to be a part of efforts towards those who do not know Jesus, especially those who have never heard (Acts 1:8, Mark 16:15)

# **GUIDING QUESTIONS**

These guiding questions keep us on track as a church. Time in these questions ensures we are loving God, one another, and the world well as we plan ministry and face decisions. They can be used for the church as a whole or for individuals. For example, we may be asked to participate in an event put on by other organizations in our city. If we see that the event violates some of these guiding questions, we will decline participation. A family or individual could likewise use these questions when facing opportunities or decisions.

- How does this opportunity align with <u>scripture?</u>
- o Does this opportunity violate scripture in any way?
- How does this opportunity communicate or clarify the gospel?
- o Does this opportunity distort the gospel in any way?
- What have we thought and felt as we have approached this opportunity in <u>prayer</u>?
- o Have we neglected prayer in this opportunity?
- How does this opportunity help <u>integrate</u> Jesus into their home, work, and leisure?
- o Could this opportunity harmfully segregate Jesus from parts of our life?
- How does this opportunity foster <u>relationships?</u>
- o Is there a risk for shallowness, superficiality, isolation, or partiality?
- How will this opportunity <u>equip</u> the church family for life in Christ?
- o Are we missing any opportunities to develop someone?
- How does this opportunity support healthy <u>rhythms</u> of work and rest?
- o Will this opportunity overwork someone?
- How does this opportunity serve the <u>community</u> of Troy or beyond?
- o Does this opportunity risk the dignity of our neighbor or create a power dynamic?

**3. Leadership:** Troy Church is led by **ELDERS.** We take this concept from the leadership structure of the New Testament church.

The **Roles** of elders in Troy Church specifically are as follows. The terms *elder* and *pastor* are synonymous. Troy Church refers to many elder roles with the term *pastor*.

- LEAD PASTOR- Full-time staff elder responsible for leadership and teaching.
- **FAMILY/ COMMUNITY PASTOR-** Full-time staff elder responsible for children, youth, and community ministries.
- FINANCE/ FOREIGN MISSIONS PASTOR- Lay elder responsible for budget oversight and missions giving.
- SMALL GROUPS PASTOR- Lay elder responsible for all groups/ discipleship strategy.
- SHEPHERDING PASTOR- Lay elder responsible for membership and prayer.
- ELDERS- Additional active lay elders that help with any of the above functions

The Qualifications are many. (1 Tim 3:2-7 and Titus 1:6-9)

- The husband of one wife
- Sober-minded
- Self-controlled
- Respectable

- Hospitable
- Able to teach
- Not a drunkard
- Not violent but gentle
- Not quarrelsome
- Not a lover of money

The **Process** for ordaining an elder is prayer and fasting, a period of evaluation, and the laying on of hands. (*Luke 6:12-13, Acts 6:6; 13:2-3, 1 Tim 5:22*)

The **Gender** for an elder is always masculine in Scripture.

**TEAM LEADS:** In Troy Church, we have **Team Leads** who lead ministry teams of volunteers. Many Team Leads function like New Testament deacons. Team Leads are appointed by elders and affirmed by the church. The biblical background of deacons is used in our appointment of Team Leads. The **Qualification** for deacons shares those of elders without an expectation of teaching. The **Process** for appointing a deacon is prayer and fasting and period of evaluation (1 Tim. 3:8-13). The **Gender** for deacons is both masculine and feminine in Scripture (Rm. 16:1).

The following teams are led by **Team Leads**:

#### **LOVE GOD TEAMS:**

- Worship- Leads church in worship through music.
- Set Up- Manages preparation and cleanup of meeting space.
- Media- Manages A/V, video, and technical needs.
- Host- Leads greeters and hospitality efforts.
- Communications- Leads outside communication and social media.

#### LOVE ONE ANOTHER TEAMS:

- Women's Ministry- Assists elders in facilitating discipleship of women.
- Men's Ministry- Creates opportunities for fellowship among men.
- Small-Group- Resources small group leaders and hosts.
- Troy Kids- Leads all ministry to babies through third graders.
- Connections- Assists current and prospective members with involvement.

#### LOVE THE WORLD TEAMS:

- Local Missions- Leads local missional efforts.
- Foreign Missions- Leads efforts through foreign partners.
- Benevolence- Leverages resources for needs in and outside the church.
- Campus Outreach- Evangelism and discipleship on Troy Campus.

Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet.
- R10: John 3:36 | Whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.
- R11: Romans 8:5-9 | For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. For to set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot. Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.
- R12: Hebrews 11:6 | And without faith, it is impossible to please God...
- **R13:** Romans 3:10-12 | None is righteous, no, not one; no one understands; no one seeks for God. All have turned aside; together they are worthless; no one does good, not even one.
- **R14:** Romans 14:23 | Whatever does not proceed from faith is sin.
- R15: Acts 3:19 | Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out...
- R16: Romans 10:11-13 | For the scripture says, 'Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.'

  There is no distinction between the Jew and the Greek, for the same Lord is Lord of all, who richly blesses all who call on him. For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

- **R17:** Ephesians 2:8-9 | For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.
- **R18:** John 3:8 | The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So, it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.
- **R19:** Romans 9:15-16 | For He says to Moses, "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." So, then it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God, who has mercy.
- R20: Romans 8:28-30 | And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose. For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, in order that He might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those whom He predestined He also called, and those whom He called He also justified, and those whom He justified He also glorified.
- **R21:** Ephesians 2:4-5 | But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ by grace you have been saved . . .
- **R22:** 1 Peter 1:3 | Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead . . .
- **R23:** Hebrews 10:24-25 | And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another...as you see the Day drawing near.
- **R24:** 1 Peter 4:10 | As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace.

## Appendix 2: One Another Commands

#### Accept one another

Therefore accept one another, just as the Messiah also accepted you, to the glory of God. (Romans 15:7)

Therefore, God's chosen ones, holy and loved, put on heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, accepting one another and forgiving one another if anyone has a complaint against another. Just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you must also forgive. (Colossians 3:12–13)

#### Admonish one another

Let the message about the Messiah dwell richly among you, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, and singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, with gratitude in your hearts to God.

(Colossians 3:16)

## Agree with one another

Be in agreement with one another. Do not be proud; instead, associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own estimation. (Romans 12:16)

### Bear with one another

Walk worthy of the calling you have received, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love. (Ephesians 4:2)

### Build up one another

So then, we must pursue what promotes peace and what builds up one another. (Romans 14:19)

#### Care for one another

God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the less honorable so that there would be no division in the body but that the members would have the same concern for each other. (1 Corinthians 12:25)

## Carry one another's burdens

Carry one another's burdens; in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)

### Comfort one another

Therefore encourage (comfort) one another with these words. (1 Thessalonians 4:18)

## Be Compassionate to one another

And be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving one another, just as God also forgave you in Christ. (Ephesians 4:32)

#### Confess sins to one another

Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The urgent request of a righteous person is very powerful in its effect. (James 5:16)

## Be Devoted to one another

Show family affection to one another with brotherly love. (Romans 12:10a)
