Hast thou no scar?
No hidden scar on foot, or side, or hand?
I hear thee sung as mighty in the land,

Who has no wound nor scar?

Shortly after her accident, Carmichael had voiced the fear that her injury had left her too great a burden to others. She was concerned she'd prove a hindrance to the work she had begun. A friend brought comfort by drawing her mind to Revelation 2:9-10 which includes the words: "I know" and "fear not." Carmichael had the words painted onto a two-part plaque and mounted where she could always see them. Later, reflecting on them, she told in a poem what they had come to mean to her.

"I know": the words contain Unfathomable comfort for our pain.
How they can hold such depths I do not know—
I only know that it is so.
"Fear not": the words have power
To give the thing they name; for in an hour
Of utter weariness, the soul, aware of One beside her bed,
Is comforted.

O Lord most dear,
I thank Thee, and I worship—
Thou art here.

Hermína (Mín) Míhalík

June 24, 1951 – June 16, 2025

Hermína “Mín” Míhalík (née Brak) was born in Harold, Ontario, to Willem and Hermína Brak. She was the third of eight daughters, growing up on a farm in Batawa alongside her twin sisters Nellie and Annie, and younger sisters Willy, Clara, Corry, Jane, and Carolin.

Mín trained in nursing at Quinte Secondary School and worked at Belleville General Hospital as a nurse and later as an AP clerk.

She met her husband, Donald Míhalík, on a blind date. They married in 1987 and were blessed with two children—Amanda in 1988 and Donald Jr. in 1990. The family settled in Ottawa, where they became active members of Grace Presbyterian Church.

After Don's passing in 2005 from Huntington's Disease, Mín devoted herself to caring for their son and working as a seamstress and caregiver.

Mín was creative and industrious. She loved gardening, bird watching, sewing, knitting, painting, and building things with her hands - she was a female “Bob the Builder”. She had a passion for history and Bible study. Her faith, family, and community meant everything to her.

In the spring of 2025, Mín was diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer. She passed away peacefully on June 16, surrounded by her daughter and close friends.
