We are also looking forward to doing the wedding ceremony for a Private First Class in June, who will be coming home from Okinawa to wed his high school sweetheart. He will be returning to Japan shortly after the honeymoon. We bought two Bibles to present to the couple during the service. We have had several funerals, others scheduled, with over 200 in attendance at our most recent service. We did a memorial service for a Medal of Honor recipient, Lt. General Lawrence Nicholson was present, and we have been invited once again to speak at the Gold Star Mothers and Family Day. We were involved with the Marine Roses Program, and have a host of doctor appointments scheduled. Our firstborn grandson recently graduated from the University of Tennessee, School of Engineering, and will be entering the PhD program in the fall. Congratulations Ethan!

Recently, we submitted a couple of articles to the Department of Tennessee. We were unaware, until we started receiving feedback, that the Commandant shared these articles with a multitude of Marines. She wrote, "Honor, Courage, Commitment... I know we have all enjoyed the words of wisdom from Chaplain Ron. He submitted two more articles to the State Convention that I would like to share with you. We now have six Marines that tag along for our visits to the Veterans Home. We spent a great deal of time with a Marine yesterday who was on Saipan in the Marianna Islands, which was "one of the bloodiest battles in U.S. military annals." In the end, U.S. casualties were 16,525 dead, wounded, and missing. There were also 20,000 civilian casualties. Harlan, who is 101 years old, insisted that I feel all of the bone and shrapnel fragments in his torso. That was awkward! Maybe they will give me a medal, or a certificate for doing that! We have distributed tracts to almost everyone, including staff members, and several residence of the home have received New Testaments. We have prayer with as many as possible, and they all look forward to the time we spend with them. It is impossible at times to break away from one lonely soul and move on to another one. Hospital and rehab facility visits are made regularly.
