The Anglican Church

As Anglicans we believe that God is eternal, the earth maker, the pain bearer, the life giver; source of all that is and shall be; father and mother of us all. We learn that God is one, yet revealed as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer - a Holy Trinity.

We believe that Christians learn about God in the Bible, in the teaching of the Church summed up in the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds, and through sharing in the living community of faith. We believe Jesus Christ was incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. We are an Apostolic Church, meaning that Bishops are a part of our leadership and we can trace our line of Bishops back to the 12 Apostles.

As Anglicans we get to know God by God's initiative in our thinking and understanding: by experiencing and reflecting on the wonder and mystery of creation, birth and death, love, forgiveness and the need to find meaning and worth beyond ourselves.

Everyone is welcome at St. John's, whether you were raised Anglican, or followed another faith, or you have no faith background at all. We hope you find what you are looking for in our service today.

Our Service Today - Baptism

This liturgy (the words we say) comes from the Book of Alternative Services, and is the common, contemporary Anglican liturgy.

Today is a service of Baptism. Baptism is the sign of new life in Christ and unites Christ with his people. When we become baptized, we make a commitment to follow Jesus. In the Anglican Church, children may be baptized, with parents and sponsors making these commitments for them.

The Celebration of Baptism - Thanksgiving over the Water

Holy Water is poured into the font

Celebrant At the beginning of time,

you blessed Mother earth with water.

And during each pregnancy,

John the Baptiser used water to baptize

in the Jordan River.

Jesus used water to wash his disciples' feet. May this water of baptism wash and purify. May this water renew our own baptism

The Giving of the Light

The Baptismal candle is lit.

A sponsor from the Congregation will give the candidate a lighted candle.

Sponsor Walk in the faith of Christ crucified and risen.

Shine with the light of Christ

All The light of Christ is in our midst.

Sponsor Here is a candle to keep as you grow,

to light at each stepping stone of your life

so as to remind you of your baptism.

All Receive the light of Christ!

In joy we welcome you to this community of

faith.

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Baptismal Hymn - This Child of Ours, This Miracle

As the Baptismal Anthem is sung, Blake, Parents and Sponsors may proceed with the celebrant as he sprinkles the congregation with holy water to remind them of their own baptism in Christ.

The Proclamation of the Word

The First Reading: Read by Ann Burch. A reading from the Book of Ezekiel.

Thus says the Lord God: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. The Second Reading: Read by Leeann Price.

A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to Timothy.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully. As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.
