

#### 2 Peter 2:1-10

Big Idea: False teachers threaten the church with destructive heresies. Know God's Word to discern truth from lies. True believers bear fruit of changed lives. God judges evil but preserves the righteous. Contend earnestly for the faith, showing mercy to doubters while snatching others from the fire.

# Day 1: Recognizing False Teachings

Reading: 2 Peter 2:1-3

Peter reminds of the importance of discernment in our faith. False teachings can appear enticing, even within our church communities. But God's Word equips us to recognize truth. Today, reflect on your spiritual foundations. Are they built on the solid rock of Scripture? Ask God for wisdom to discern truth from falsehood, and for the courage to stand firm in sound doctrine. Remember, our ultimate allegiance is to Christ alone, not to any human teacher or philosophy.

#### Where is Your Confidence?

2 Peter 1:16-21

Big Idea: "Where is your confidence?" The challenge to us is to trust God's Word above all. The Bible isn't myth, but eyewitness testimony & fulfilled prophecy. Like a light in darkness, Scripture guides us. Don't drift in faith—anchor yourself in God's truth, not human opinion.

## Day 2: God's Judgment and Preservation

Reading: 2 Peter 2:4-9

Today's passage might seem harsh, but it reveals a profound truth about God's character. He is both just and merciful. While God doesn't hesitate to judge evil, He also faithfully preserves those who trust in Him. Think about times in your life when you've experienced God's protection or deliverance. How has His faithfulness sustained you through trials? Take a moment to thank Him for His preserving grace, and pray for strength to remain faithful in the face of worldly temptations.

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### Day 3: The Power of God's Word

Reading: 2 Peter 1:19-21

Scripture is our lifeline in a world full of conflicting voices. It's not merely human wisdom, but the very breath of God, superintended by the Holy Spirit. As you read today, consider how you approach God's Word. Do you treat it as a casual read, or as the living, active voice of your Creator? Challenge yourself to engage more deeply with Scripture. Perhaps commit to memorizing a verse this week, or spend extra time meditating on a passage. Ask God to illuminate His Word in your heart and transform you through its truth.

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
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### Day 4: Living as New Creations

### Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Salvation isn't just about escaping judgment—it's about becoming a new creation in Christ. This newness should radically change how we live. Reflect on how your life has changed since coming to faith. Are there areas where you still cling to old patterns or worldly values? Pray for the Holy Spirit to continue His transforming work in you. Consider one specific way you can "put off the old self" and embrace your identity in Christ today. Remember, this transformation is God's work in us, empowered by His grace.

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## Day 5: Contending for the Faith

Reading: Jude 1:3-4, 20-23

Our faith journey isn't meant to be passive. We're called to actively "contend for the faith," defending truth and living it out boldly. This doesn't mean being argumentative, but rather standing firm in love and truth. How can you contend for the faith in your sphere of influence? It might mean lovingly correcting a misconception about God, or simply living in a way that demonstrates Christ's love. Pray for opportunities to share your faith, and for the courage to seize them when they come. Ask God to fill you with His love for others, even those who may oppose the gospel.

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
