
July 27 Fourth Parable of the Summer

Object; lots of expensive looking objects.

(KIDS can stand in a line, waiting to say their lines, meanwhile acting along, or enter as needed. KIDS can have their own lines, or several lines, or different little groups can have their own lines, or they can all say all the lines together.)

NAR. 1 There once was a rich man, in a land most abundant. He had everything needed to be filled with happiness and contentment. And the workers of his land enjoyed peace and fulfillment.

WORKER 1a; Life is good.

WORKER 1b; We have enough food.

NAR. 2; But there came a day. when the mean rich man saw, that he could have more. He was struck with selfishness. So, <u>he laid down the law!</u>

WORKER 2a; Our boss has become harsher.

WORKER 2b; He will work us harder.

NAR. 1; As the mean rich man grew greedier and greedier, he forced his workers to work harder and harder with less and less food. And so, very soon, they could not work at all. This was not goo-od.

WORKER 3a; I'm so hungry I could holler.

WORKER 3b; He's not even giving us a dollar!

NAR. 2; With the money the mean rich man made. he bought lots of stuff. Every day he bought something. but it was never enough. He needed more storage. Soon he had no room for his junk. Everything needed a shelf, a drawer, a closet or a trunk!!!

WORKER 4a; Why has he bought all this stuff?

WORKER 4b; Our life is now very, very tough.

NAR. 1; Soon there was nothing left for the mean rich man to buy! The workers were penniless, and were ready to fall. But blinded by greed, he could not hear their call.

WORKER 5a; Too tired to walk.

WORKER 5b; Too tired to crawl.

NAR. 2 One day, the mean rich man encountered Jesus and said to Him, "Good Master, What do I need to do to enter Heaven? I have always kept the 10 Commandments." Jesus replied; "There is just one thing more that you need to do. Sell all that you have and give the money to the poor. You will have riches in heaven. Then, come, and follow me,"

NAR. 1 At first the mean rich man could not believe it! Then he thought about it and he opened his eyes. "I don't think I have been very wise!" My things are piled high here, there and everywhere. I have never even used them.

I have never even needed them!" And realizing he was no longer happy, he asked himself, "What am I doing? I am not being fair. This is like a nightmare."


Let's sing about Jesus!
