Pastor's Page

On Sunday, July 20th, we had a guest musician, Dennis Alfveby, in worship. You may recognize the name as he has often accompanied musical groups at River Falls High School. In worship, one of the pieces he played was the familiar hymn God of Grace and God of Glory. As he was playing this past week, I was struck by the words of that hymn. I have always loved the refrain—grant us wisdom, grant us courage, but this week I was struck by the almost prayer like petitions buried in the hymn: cure your children's warring madness, bend our mind to your control, and shame our wanton selfish gladness, rich in things and poor in soul. These words seem oddly appropriate for our day and age.

When you think about it, there is something wonderful about singing together. Sometimes it is easier to sing our faith and say our faith out loud. And singing with others, well for someone like me who tends to sing out of tune, when we get a large group together, as we had this past summer Sunday, and when the organ is going full tilt, it is easy to belt out familiar tune like Ethel Merman (google it young people).

God is present and active in our world and lives. In worship, we are reminded of this, plus given a front row seat as we seek to see the concrete ways God is leading and guiding us through a complex and turbulent world. And if you want to hear Dennis play the hymn yourself, check out the livestream at 1:04 on Sunday, July 20th, it was the final hymn. Perhaps clip the words below from this newsletter and use them as your prayer this week.

Grant us wisdom, grant us courage for the facing of this hour, O God. Amen.

God of grace and God of glory, on your people pour your power;

Crown your ancient church's story; bring its bud to glorious flower.

Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the facing of this hour.

Lo, the hosts of evil round us, scorn your Christ, assail your ways;

Before each funeral two families, Judy and Gary Grimm and Dianne and Al Barnes lovingly set the tables so grieving families can have time to laugh, cry and tell stories together over a wonderful meal. This is aided by Diane Welsh, Pat Anderson and Marlys Peterson who help run the kitchen and dining room. This is a huge gift to families and almost no other churches are still able to pull this off. When you see them, thank them. And consider volunteering the next time you get an email telling of the death in the church family. Whether you volunteer your time or provide baked goods, you are a church angel. Bless you all.
