THIS SUNDAY AT ST. JOHN'S

❖ Today is the Eighth Sunday after Pentecost. The Season after Pentecost (the long, green season also commonly known as Ordinary Time) begins following Pentecost Sunday and ends on Christ the King Sunday, November 23, 2025. This season focuses on discipleship and the teachings of Jesus. Our Gospel texts come from Luke.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MATT HANSEN

People of St. John's:

This Sunday's Gospel text underscores the fragility of life and the foolishness of storing up treasures for yourself while neglecting God's will. To Jesus, this is anxious accumulation: *more* savings, *more* security, *more* control. But none of it lasts. Our first reading sets the tone for that.



But let's be real: The rich man in the Gospel parable is not condemned for his success. He's condemned for his isolation. He talks only to himself. He builds bigger barns, but no wider tables. He prepares for everything, well, except death. He's rich in things, but poor toward God.

At St. John's, we're blessed with a strong heritage, a thriving community of believers, and a beautiful property. I hope today's parable reminds us that our purpose isn't simply to maintain what we've inherited. We're called to use it boldly, generously, and faithfully for the sake of our neighbors and the gospel.

How can we be rich toward God in this moment? What barns do we need to stop building so we can make room for something more lasting, more in line with God's will?

FIRST READING: ECCLESIASTES 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23

A reading from Ecclesiastes.

² Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

¹² I, the Teacher, was king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³ I applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to humans to be busy with. ¹⁴ I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun, and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

^{2:18} I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to my successor, ¹⁹ and who knows whether he will be wise or foolish? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. ²⁰ So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labors under the sun, ²¹ because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. ²² What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? ²³ For all their days are full of pain, and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

PSALM 49:1-12

We read a portion of Psalm 49 responsively by verse.

¹ Hear this, all you peoples; give ear, all inhabitants of the world, ² both low and high, rich and poor together.

³My mouth shall speak wisdom; the meditation of my heart shall be understanding.

⁴I will incline my ear to a proverb; I will solve my riddle to the music of the harp.

⁵Why should I fear in times of trouble, when the iniquity of my persecutors surrounds me,

⁶ those who trust in their wealth and boast of the abundance of their riches?

- ⁷ Truly, no ransom avails for one's life; there is no price one can give to God for it.
- ⁸For the ransom of life is costly and can never suffice,
- ⁹ that one should live on forever and never see the Pit.
- ¹⁰When we look at the wise, they die; fool and dolt perish together and leave their wealth to others.
- ¹¹ Their graves are their homes forever, their dwelling places to all generations, though they named lands their own.
- ¹² Mortals cannot abide in their pomp; they are like the animals that perish.

SECOND READING: COLOSSIANS 3:1-11


A reading from Colossians.

¹ So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on the things that are above, not on the things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷ These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸ But now you must get rid of all such things: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹ In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, enslaved and free, but Christ is all and in all!

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to [Jesus,] "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." ¹⁶ Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷ And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' ¹⁸ Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."


