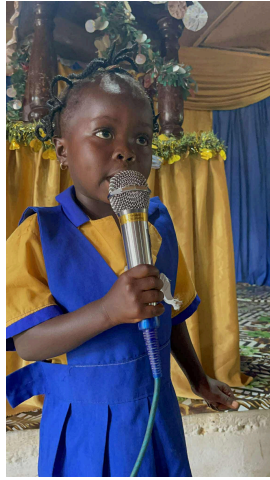

A Beautiful Beginning

In a world full of headlines that highlight brokenness, our ministry exists to be a different kind of story—a story of redemption, hope, and the healing power of family.

A BCH Care Family recently opened their home and hearts to a 4-year-old boy through our Christ-centered US ministry to families in crisis. Her words remind us all why this ministry matters—and what it looks like to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the most personal, tangible ways:

"Today was our first day with this little gift from God for as long as needed. And I don't know where to begin.

This morning, we opened our door—and our hearts—to a 4-year-old boy whose eyes are too wise for his age. The moment he stepped out of the car wearing a cautious little smile, we felt the shift inside. It wasn't just the sound of his still, small voice, it was the quiet hope walking beside him.

He is so intelligent. So perceptive. Within minutes, he was asking thoughtful questions. He loves the farm! He is ready to "drive the tractor alone."

It is clear that life has already taught him far more than a 4-year-old should ever have to know. But he is still just a little boy. He smacked my husband's bald head and said, "you're Dad", and pointed to me and said, "you're Mom." And I said "yes" with my whole heart.

He doesn't know yet that he has already changed us. He doesn't know that his courage, just to show up and trust strangers, has cracked our hearts wide open. Fostering isn't easy. We know that. But today... today was beautiful.

Welcome home, little one. We're so glad you are here as God allows. May the Lord bless you and keep you."

In moments like these, we are reminded that BCH doesn't just provide support services—we offer sacred spaces for restoration, one child and one courageous caregiver at a time. This is the Gospel in action. This is what love looks like.

To the Care Mom who wrote this letter: **thank you.** Thank you for saying "yes" with your whole heart. You are showing the world what it means to live surrendered to God's call to love the least of these.
