### Pastor Hagerty writes...

What is faith? Why is it important to us? And what do we do with this faith? Faith is having complete trust or confidence in someone or something. For us as Christians, that someone or something is Jesus Christ.

As I was reading the assigned scriptures for Sunday, August 10th, this faith appears to be the main thing in all three lessons. As we are called to step out and follow Christ, we may be focused on family, financial concerns, retirement, and more, but Christ says to us, "It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." (Luke 12:32) With these words of encouragement, why would we grow weary in our faith?



# **Church Council Minutes** July 13, 2025

Called to order in the Parish Hall by President Don Hill at 10:58 am.

Opening Prayer by Pastor Hagerty

Check Roll: Pastor Hagerty, Don Hill, Gale Smith, Sandi Martini, Lacy Derrick, Christy Brasington, and Jennifer Wicker

Absent: Beth Bedenbaugh, Fred Falls, and Deb Morell

### **Treasurer's Reports**

The Consolidated Fund Activity Report shows that we ended the month of June with a current operating fund balance of \$86,021.41. Our current operating fund expenses during the month of June were \$17,744.92. Our June receipts were \$23,459.41. We are still off to a very good start after the first six (6) months of 2025.

The June 2025 consolidated activity report includes the following designated fund totals: Capital improvement fund: \$37,409.39 (contains \$30,485 of the roof replacement funds)

Sanctuary enhancements fund: \$20,684.58

Cemetery fund: \$53.32

Social Ministry / Outreach Fund: \$656.37

STLC Youth Fund: \$3,442.28 JLB Endowment Principal Bal-

ance: \$83.674.39

JLB Endowment Interest Bal-

ance: \$27,553.94

JLB Loan Balance: \$24,910.63

Don asked Jennifer about our current fund balance and how giving compares to last year. We have received \$127,613.00 year-todate. Last year's year-to-date total was \$99,100.62. We are \$14,099 ahead of our budget as of the end of June.

Christy asked where the reports show the activity of the cemetery fund during the month of June. It is listed in our chart of accounts under account #3400. We took out \$268.75, leaving a cemetery fund balance of only \$53.32.

We discussed adjusting next year's church budget for the grounds account #5307. We will ask the Stewardship and Finance Committee to stop taking \$300 per month out of the cemetery fund, since it has been depleted. We suggest increasing our budgeted amount for grounds in 2026 by \$3,600. For the remainder of the year 2025, we need to continue paying our grounds crew our contracted amount. We will charge the entire amount to account #5307. We now anticipate going over budget in account #5307 by \$300 per month for the remaining six (6) months of 2025.

Jennifer brought up the payroll clearing account #2999. This is listed under liabilities in the treasurer's reports. She has been following the advice of Alicia on how we handle this. Don requested that Jennifer provide council with further explanation.

Lacy asked about the line items that have asterisks. Jennifer will clarify whether the asterisks indicate accounts that are over budget. For example, our current fund income as of the end of June is \$14,099 higher than our budgeted current fund income.

Pastor requested that we set up a VBS designated fund in order to have a place to receive funds for VBS unexpected expenses. We will ask the Stewardship and Finance Committee.

In the meantime, we can receive funds for VBS expenses via undesignated memorial donations. Funds can then be transferred to the new VBS designated fund after it is set up.

Don will notify the Stewardship and Finance Committee via email of our request to set up a VBS designated account. We will seek their feedback and approval.

Jennifer Wicker was dismissed at 11:20 am

### Pastor's Report

We continue to provide weekly worship resources to the congregation. They include:

- 1. In-person worship services are held at 10:00 am on Sundays.
- 2. YouTube worship videos are filmed and edited by Emory Bedenbaugh. Through July 13<sup>th</sup>, we have done 243 videos.
- 3. On-line bulletins and sermon transcripts in pdf format are emailed to the church family and hand-delivered to 22 household locations.
- 4. Worship video links are being emailed to our church family and posted on our website of: <a href="www.stthomaschapin.com">www.stthomaschapin.com</a>. They are also posted to our St. Thomas Facebook page and boosted to the Chapin area.
- 5. We had Holy Communion at the altar rail on the festival Sunday of The Holy Trinity on June 15<sup>th</sup>. We had Holy Communion by intinction on July 6<sup>th</sup>. Our in-person worship attendance for June was 54. We averaged 118 views per week on YouTube for our prerecorded Sunday worship videos.

Other activities include:

1. Confirmation class and Sunday School classes are taking a ten (10) week break for

the summer. We will resume classes on Sunday, August 10<sup>th</sup>. In the meantime, Pastor offered a Tuesday Bible Study:" How Lutherans Interpret the Bible."

- 2. Our Young at Heart (YAH) seniors' group will meet this Tuesday, July 15th for hamburgers, cheeseburgers, and fellowship.
- 3. Pastor and Tracey Hagerty attended the SC Synod Assembly in North Charleston on June 12<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup>. Andrew Boozer was elected Vice President of the SC Synod for a six-year term. He will chair Synod Council meetings. Three resolutions were passed and will be forwarded to council.
- 4. The 2025 Dutch Fork Cluster Beach Retreat at the Isle of Palms Coastal Retreat Center took place June 19<sup>th</sup> to June 22<sup>nd</sup>. We filled twelve (12) rooms and had twenty-seven (27) people who attended. This included twenty (20) adults and seven (7) children We had attendees from five (5) different Lutheran churches. Our devotional theme focused on the resource: "A Lutheran Welcome to Jesus" by Daniel Erlander.
- 5. We are working with Bethel Lutheran Church to provide a Vacation Bible School from July 20<sup>th</sup> through the 24<sup>th</sup> at St Thomas using the "Road Trip" curriculum. Each day will start with a meal at 5:30 pm and the program will be from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. We have secured the Rev. Dr. Bobby Morris to be our speaker for our VBS adult class on the first two evenings. A volunteer meeting will take place today, July 13<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm. We are planning to have a youth class.
- 6. Pastor officiated at the memorial service for Colonel Raymund Rennebaum at Fort Jackson Memorial Cemetery on June 27<sup>th</sup>.
- 7. Pastor officiated at the memorial service for Lee Howard Wessinger on July 2nd.

8. Pastor will pursue Church Fuel coaching with Elizabeth Hill once VBS is over. We will work on purpose and mission statements using their two-page plan.

### Stewardship and Finance

2026 Budget – Committee Budget inputs for Calendar year 2026 are due at the end of August; recommend Committee leads use 2025 budget input as a starting place.

### **Cemetery**

Christy provided a written report. The memorial wall plaque for the columbarium donations has been installed thanks to Ron Derrick and Rick Rennebaum. Lee Wessinger's ashes were interred on July 2, 2025 and a veteran's marker and flag were placed.

The initial meeting with Ricky Waites, Susan Waites, Janet Tapp, and Anne Shealy looked at several possible locations for the scatter garden. The location has not yet been determined. Research is being conducted to gather some inspiration for the site once the location has been set.

### **Christian Education**

Beth Bedenbaugh submitted a written report. The next Christian Ed committee meeting will be on Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup> following worship. New year for Sunday School starts 10 August. We hope to have a small gettogether / kick-off before going to class or maybe after class and before church.

## Property

- 1. Roof Replacement installation is complete and invoice paid.
- 2. We have signed the contract with Duffie Driveway Solutions as approved by the council via email for \$2,080.00 to re-

point the mortar between the steps of the Church. Waiting on a date for the work to be done.

- 3. After the work on the steps is complete, we will engage Trinity Window and Home Washing to soft wash the Church and Fellowship Hall at a cost of \$1,470.00 as approved by the council via email.
- 4. The Property Committee would like to thank Ricky for his work on improving the landscape to the right of the church. It looks nice.
- Columbarium Memorial Plaque was installed on the Memorial Wall.
- 6. Weed control- spraying around the shed area.
- 7. Plan a meeting in August- September to discuss next major project.

Christy mentioned that she picked up several nails in the cemetery driveway following the roof replacement. Other nails on the grass might be kicked back onto the driveway when the grass is mowed. Just wanted folks to be aware.

We discussed the memorial marker for the Rev. Dr. Ken Webb. It was associated with a sycamore tree that had to be cut down because its roots blocked our sewer line. There is a need to find a new location where another sycamore tree could be planted and have the marker relocated. We will approach Ricky Waites and get his opinion on a good location for planting the tree.

### **Outreach and Evangelism**

Council liaison Gale Smith submitted a written report. Our mission is to "Promote a feeling of community and show kindness and caring."

The committee has not met since our last council meeting.

CPR / AED / First Aid training is scheduled for August 9<sup>th</sup> from 9 am to 11:15 am. We have 8 people signed up. More can be accommodated, but we need to know asap. Money has be secured for the first 8. If cost is a problem for any others, help may be available. There is an online portion of the training that must be completed prior to the class. Beth Ervin will be emailing this to the participants. Training will be in the fellowship hall.

Reminders: Women's self-defense class will be held on July 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am in the fellowship hall. Anyone 17-18 years old will need a parent to attend with them.

Outdoor movie night has been postponed until fall when the weather cools off.

The Advent brunch will be held on Sunday December 14<sup>th</sup>.

### Children's and Youth Ministry

There will be a class for children as well as youth at our Road Trip VBS.. If Outreach and Evangelism have a game night, we hope the youth can participate.

### Worship and Music

Ginny will attend the celebration of son Zachary's internship at Epiphany Lutheran Church in Winston Salem, NC on Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup>. Laura Langston will be our guest musician at Saint Thomas.

Looking ahead to Homecoming: Zach Lindler will preach on September 28<sup>th</sup> 2025 and Rev. Robert Miles will preach on September 27<sup>th</sup> 2026 for our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The adult choir will resume on Monday, July 28<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.

### **New Business**

- 1) It was suggested by Beth Bedenbaugh that we rename the adult Sunday School room in memory of Mr. Lee Wessinger. More to follow on that.
- 2) We discussed having some sort of recognition of members of Saint Thomas who have served the church with distinction. It may involve having family

- members nominate their loved ones for this recognition. More to follow on this.
- 3) Don has been receiving information periodically from the ELCA and will forward it to our church council for their information.
- 4) Pastor will forward the three (3) resolutions that passed at our recent SC Synid Assembly along with a link to the SC Synod website and a video recording of the assembly.

Pastor concluded the meeting with the Lord's Prayer at 11:59 am..

# **Dutch Fork Cluster Beach Retreat**

However, June 19-22, 2025, was the cluster's first cluster retreat held at the Coastal Retreat Center on the Isle of Palms SC Lutheran Conference and Retreat Centers offers two great places to visit (Coastal and Camp Kinard) and provides great accommodations for those seeking renewal and fellowship. On Friday morning and Saturday mornings after wonderful southern breakfasts, multi-generational retreat participants ranging from a year old to a 90-year-old worshipped Jesus with songs and also through devotions by reading "A Lutheran Welcome to Jesus" by Daniel Erlander. This was such a good way to start our days, which later included more gathering time on the beach in the late mornings, early afternoons and evenings. Most meals

were cooked by participants from the various Cluster churches, but our community also enjoyed seafood and other deliciously cooked evening meals from local restaurants

Getting to know others in a retreat setting was a great way to experience our understanding of being a part of the body of Christ. Several of us rose before breakfast on Sunday morning to enjoy a worship at sunrise on the beach at 6:15 AM. Hearing the words of Jesus while His creation is starting a new day at the sea is an awesome experience to behold. This and our time together during the four-day retreat gave everyone the time to reflect on Jesus's goodness and love. We realize that outside that retreat setting there is an unkind world, but through our faith, we rely on Jesus and know that He is with us.
