More Than Been There, Done That, Got the T-shirt

As summer wanes, ELCA congregations nationwide prepare for a synod outreach program called "God's Work Our Hands" (GWOH). Most of us at Zion's are familiar with GWOH through the bright yellow shirts emblazoned with the God's Work catchphrase and Zion's name on the back. Since 2013, the ELCA designates the second Sunday of September (this year Sept. 7) as God's Work Our Hands Sunday. This is an opportunity for congregations throughout the country to celebrate who we are as part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America — one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor.

Service activities associated with this day allow us to explore a basic Lutheran conviction: that all of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, every daily calling, every corner of life — flows freely from our living out a daring confidence in God's grace.

Zion's traditionally observes the day with a fellowship worship and picnic in one of the local parks as well as a related community service project. Through the years, Zion's projects have included activities such as cleaning riverbanks or helping feed the homeless.

At Zion's, we also acknowledge our calling in activities during the year. Often, these are times we are encouraged to wear our yellow GWOH shirts – Santa Fe Trail Days, Thanksgiving Dinner, and the annual Garage Sale, etc.

After each event, as I wash my shirt and put it away until our next activity, I wonder whether it is too easy to likewise put away my "acts of service." I try to remind myself that, with or without the yellow shirt, all of us still are called to share our daring confidence in God's grace. God's Work Our Hands is not an annual event, it is a year-round commitment to ourselves and to one another.

This happens in acts of simple service to one another, to our community, and even globally. We share it each Sunday during fellowship as we welcome and celebrate everyone. We share it in 5-Loaves meals, workdays at church, visitations, and during special services of worship.

Yes, GWOH events provide us an opportunity to come together wearing our yellow shirts in public settings to share our welcoming, daring confidence in the grace of God -- loving, celebrating, and welcoming people of all faith backgrounds, ethnicities, cultures, ages, abilities, sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions.

We also see God's Work Our Hands at Zion's in individual acts of welcome, of members who check on one another, who provide transport for those who need assistance, of those who care for animals, and so much more.

We know -- with or without a yellow shirt -- as people of God, our acts of service, our everyday callings are reflections of God's Work Our Hands. It is a message reinforced in the Kyrie we've sung each Sunday this summer, particularly verse 2:

"That we may live out your impassioned response to the hungry and the poor; that we may live out truth and justice and grace, let us pray to the Lord, let us pray to the Lord Kyrie eleison, on our world and on our way, Kyrie eleison, ev'ry day.



ELCA Elects a New Presiding Bishop as Bishop Eaton Retires

The Rev. Yehiel Curry on Wednesday, July 30, was elected to serve a six-year term as presiding bishop of the ELCA. He replaces Bishop Elizabeth Eaton who is retiring after 12-years as presiding bishop. Curry's election took place at the 2025 ELCA Church-wide Assembly held July 28–Aug. 2 at the Phoenix Convention Center.

Assembly representative elected Curry on the fifth ballot, He received 562 of the 799 votes cast. Four hundred votes were needed for election. Kevin Strickland, bishop of the ELCA Southeastern Synod, received 237 votes.

After his election, Bishop-Elect Curry, who is the first Black presiding bishop of the ELCA, addressed the assembly and reflected upon his membership at Shekinah Chapel in



Riverdale, Illinois, where he became a lay mission developer. During that time, he participated in the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM) program, which prepares individuals for ordained ministry in the ELCA. TEEM focuses upon emerging ministry contexts such as ethnic-specific, multicultural, and both rural and urban settings and . Tis the same program that Vicar Lisa Rygiel followed in preparation for her ordination and installation as pastor at Zion's.

Bishop-elect Curry spoke to the synod assembly about his initial hesitation in accepting his first ministry role. "I'm what a return on your investment looks like," he said. "Perhaps I'm out there in one of you. I never saw myself as good enough, so for two years, I said no. I finally said yes. When I said yes, your support, this church's support of that ministry meant everything. So, if you want to know what your benevolence dollars look like, it looks like me. And I want to say thank you. Thank you for your investment."

Curry has served as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019. He previously served as mission developer (2009-2012) and pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah. He received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, III., in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013. LSTC is one of seven ELCA seminaries. Bishop-elect Curry and his wife, LaShonda, are parents of three daughters.

Zion's Renews Its Recycle Program

Beginning this month, Zion's will renew its recycling program working through *Treasures Not Trash Recycling*, a local business. The company's recycling team will collect Zion's items (especially paper and plastic) on the first Monday of each month, using large bright yellow bags they provide. When the company collects the filled bags, they will leave a set of empty ones for the next month's collections. We are grateful to Vicar Lisa for making this possible

and to Julie Wersal for taking recycled items to Pueblo until the local collections begin. In addition to these efforts, Terri Watson has placed an aluminum can recycling container in the Fellowship Hall to collect those items.


An Historic Day for Zion's Lutheran is Coming Up

Sharing Our Recipes: Peach Cobbler

The original recipe came from Bon Appetit. Like all cooks, I have tweaked the recipe. I decreased the sugar by more than half and used a splash of molasses rather than brown sugar. I also added 1/4 tsp cardamom and 1/4 tsp allspice, and substituted 1/4 tsp nutmeg instead of 1/2 tsp mace.

Brown Butter Peach Cobbler

Yield: 8-10 servings
Total Time: 1 hr & 20 minutes

Ingredients

5 Peaches (about 1½ lb.)

2 Tbs. Dark Brown Sugar

1 Tsp. Ground Cinnamon

1/2 Tsp. Mace

2 Cups (400 g) Granulated Sugar, divided

1 Cup Unsalted Butter (two sticks)

2 Cups (250 g) All-purpose Flour

1 Tbs. Baking Powder

1 Tsp. Diamond Crystal or ½ tsp. Morton Kosher Salt

2 Cups of Whole Milk

1 Tbs. Vanilla Extract



Preparations

- 1. Place a rack in middle of oven; preheat to 375°. Peel skins from 2 peaches. Halve and remove pits from all of the peaches. Slice ¼" thick. Transfer to a large bowl; add brown sugar, cinnamon, mace, and ¼ cup granulated sugar and toss to combine. Let sit while you prepare the topping (at least 20 minutes).
- 2. Cook butter in a small skillet over medium heat, stirring often, until it foams, then browns, 5–7 minutes. Pour brown butter into a 13x9" baking dish. Whisk flour, baking powder, salt, and remaining 1¾ cups sugar in a medium bowl. Whisk in milk and vanilla, then pour batter into baking dish by the ladleful so butter swirls and mixes into batter. Top with peaches.
- 3. Bake cobbler until golden brown and bubbling around the edges, about 1 hour. Let cool slightly before serving.

Church Council Updates: July 2025

Zion's Lutheran Church Council 11:30 a.m. July 13, 2025

Members present were:

Mike McNeil, Mark Moss, Mary McKenna, Julie Wersal, Terri Watson, Cheri Holder, Norine Hazen, Julie Morris, Kathy Broman Vicar Lisa Rygiel offered the invocation.

Reports:

Secretary —

The June minutes were reviewed and accepted.

Treasurer —

Reviewed actual vs. budgeted. We need approximately \$6,000 per month to cover budgeted missions and operations and are behind in securing this level of offering. Reviewed two of our mission donations of \$300 to the Synod and \$375 to ACTS. A motion was made to accept the report, approve all bills paid, and discussed the need to communicate our status with the congregation.

Financial Secretary —

RIC donation was \$979.00, an annual, onetime offering as part of the RIC process. We discussed monthly offering as the average amount needed is \$5.000.

Trust Fund —

Reports were reviewed and funds withdrawn from the trust to cover current deficit. All transfer monies come out of the liquid accounts.

Food Ministry —

Our June distribution went out to approximately 250 recipients.

We had a report of no food received by one of our participants. This home had an unsecured dog in the yard. Our volunteer drivers have been instructed to not enter to reduce chances of bites.

Chef salad has been removed from the August menu as a matter of food safety.

Vicar —

- Worship and music team met July 31 to work on the next six weeks of music. Mark Nelson has joined the team and will play when Connie is traveling.
- Reviewed status of All Creation Sings: Pew Edition Hymnals.
- Drafts for policies and use procedures for kitchen use, safety and security, facility use, weddings and funerals will be reviewed at our next meeting.
- God's Work Our Hands is scheduled for Sept. 7. Reviewed ideas for service projects with the final decision to be determined. All t-shirts are being stored in closet downstairs Fellowship Hall.

Old Business

Teams committee proposal was tabled due to inadequate time to review all aspects of the current draft.

New Business

- Garage Sale plans were reviewed to include both a garage sale and a food sale. All proceeds will benefit the ministries of Zion's.
- John Rygiel presented a thorough analysis of repairs needed for the cupola. All questions were covered in relation to the history and maintenance required. Terri Watson volunteered to assist/standby. Total estimate for the project is \$1655.00 was approved unanimously.
