The Parable

In these days of uncertainty and distress, I keep going back to scripture to figure out how to deal with all of this. Like the song says, "Lord, I want to be a Christian." How do I do that? One of my go-to verses is Micah 6:8, "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God." I see so much injustice in our world—do I ever speak out? Or do I close my eyes and pretend it's not that bad. How do I show kindness toward others and stay in a right relationship with God?

To know what to do, I lean into the words of Jesus. If we've forgotten what he taught us, it's time to read the gospels again. Jesus was in solidarity with the poor, the outcasts, the sinners. He embraced people from all walks of life. Are we doing that today? He told us to treat others as we would like to be

treated, and to treat others as though they are Jesus himself. We remember his words in Matthew 25. How do we respond to stories of violence against Jews, Muslims, immigrants, people of color, indigenous people? Do we dismiss it as though it has nothing to do with us?

Martin Niemoller was a German theologian and Lutheran pastor. He opposed the Nazi regime and was sent to a concentration camp. He wrote these chilling words that continue to call Christians today to stand with Jesus, who wasn't afraid to call out injustice and evil.

First they came for the Communists and I did not speak out because I was not a Communist. Then they came for the Socialists and I did not speak out because I was not a Socialist. Then they came for the trade unionists and I

did not speak out because I was not a trade unionist. Then they came for the Jews and I did not speak out because I was not a Jew. Then they came for me and there was no one left to speak out for me.

We don't know the future, but as followers of Jesus we know how to live in the present. It won't be easy, but we trust that God is with us. As Paul writes in Romans 8, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Go well and safely, the Lord be ever with you.



Time to go back to school - - Time to go back to reading a book from your church library! Summer days are still here, but back to school is soon approaching. This is a good time to check out a book from the church library. Some of you might be interested in these new books:

The following two books could possibly interest an older elementary girl. The 'Abigail' series is new to our library. The author, Bethany McIlrath demonstrates how a family's commitment to their shared faith can help a nine-year-old girl navigate the everyday problems young girls can face. Each book not only tells a clever, funny story about Abigail, but also successfully unpacks biblical truths that young girls can discover. The two new books are: Abigail Gets Left Out and Abigail and the Career Day Catastrophe. For adult readers: The Year of Jubilee by Cindy Morgan is a compelling book about ignorance, racial prejudice in the deep South and learning the price of forgiveness. The book *Dysfunction Junction* by Robin Pearson tells the story of three women who need to wrestle with their inability to forgive and forget in this riveting Southern family drama about sisterhood. These new books are geared to young girls and women of our church, but men - you are not forgotten - we have several books in the library that you would find interesting – just take a look!


