Following the opening songs, the youth will gather for a spiritual conversation.



### the Prayer Corner

#### A Light *Lectio Divina* for the Week

Spend some time with the Gospel reading from Sunday. Read, mark, and inwardly digest the spiritual food that is contained in it.

"Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

How to read in a spiritual manner (Lectio Divina).

- 1. Find a quiet spot and read the words of the text slowly and out loud.
- 2. After the first reading, notice when words or images jump out to you. **Connect with the ideas that inspire you.** You might even want to write them down in a spiritual journal.
- 3. After the second reading, notice any words or images that you have questions or concerns about. It is important to know that our hearts are often troubled by the words of Scripture. Maybe because they are ancient words and so removed from our time and culture. Maybe because they seem to ask for a response that we might not be willing to make. Maybe because the words have been used in the past to harm you. Whatever the reason, if there are words or images or ideas that trouble your heart and mind, write them down and give them to God.
- 4. After the third reading, **ask God to speak to your heart.** Pray, "Lord, what are you saying to me at this time and in this place through the Scripture.

Share your thoughts with a spiritual friend or with David. He loves to support you in your spiritual walk with Christ.

Remember the Scriptures are the words about the Word of God. Think of them like a stained glass window through which you get a glimpse of Jesus Christ, your friend and helper. Amen.
