


REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD


Luke's account of the Lord's Prayer is shorter than the more familiar version from Matthew's Gospel, yet it still offers insights into the importance of prayer in the life of disciples. It comes about from Jesus' disciples asking for a lesson on prayer. Jesus obliges. In addition to being succinct, the prayer emphasizes tht the disciples should call God "Father" and recognize God's name as holy. The prayer also prioritizes God's kingdom in the minds of the disciples and encourages them to make three requests in prayer. They should ask for sustenance (daily bread), forgiveness, and deliverance (from the final test). Only the request for forgiveness is conditional. It depends on the disciples' forgiveness of others.

After giving the prayer, instead of providing further commentary on it, Jesus offers additional teaching on two important aspects of prayer. First, he explores the meaning and value of praying persistently. Second, he discusses the nature of the audience of any prayer: God. In the case of persistence, Jesus tells a story in which a curious pair of ideas coalesce: friendship and tenacity. Jesus' story describes two friends, one of whom needs help providing hospitality in the middle of the night. The one being put upon naturally refuses aid initially. But, as Jesus points out, if the requester persists, his friend will help. The conclusion is that while we might consider God our friend, we should also recognize that we do not always put our requests before God at an ideal time. Thus, persistence in prayer proves necessary. Regarding the second point Jesus makes, he recalls that God-the audience of all prayer—exhibits a level of goodness that far exceeds that of human beings. God is willing and able to give the best gifts. Preeminent among God's gifts, as Jesus notes, is the gift of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, of all the gifts that we might request, it stands to reason that we should persist in asking the Lord to give us the Holy Spirit. To pray with persistence and in pursuit of the Holy Spirit complements the Lord's Prayer we know so well.



SCRIPTURE INSIGHTS: 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

This week's readings focus on prayer, trust, and God's care for us. The readings show how people turn to God with faith and hope, asking for help and guidance.

- **Persistence in Prayer:** Abraham and Jesus teach the importance of continuing to ask God for help. Both show that faith means trusting God will listen and respond.
- God's Justice and Mercy: Abraham asks God to spare the innocent when Sodom is judged. This reminds us that God is both fair and full of mercy.
- Faith and Forgiveness: Paul tells the Colossians that their sins are forgiven because of Jesus. This shows that faith brings new life and freedom from
- The Gift of Prayer: Jesus teaches his disciples how to pray, giving them the Lord's Prayer. Prayer is a way to build a deeper relationship with God.
- Trust in God's Care: Jesus says God gives good gifts to those who ask. This reminds us to trust in God, who loves and provides for us.
- **Interceding for others:** Abraham's prayer for Sodom shows the power of asking God to help others. Prayer is not just for ourselves but for those in
