### The First Word

So they said to him, "What sign are you going to give us, then, so that we may see it and believe you?

John 6:30

Signs of power—what we usually call miracles—play an important role in John's gospel. They validate the truth of what someone claims or teaches. So, the crowd finds Jesus in Capernaum and asks him some questions; after Jesus gives his answer, the crowd expects some extraordinary show of power to prove what he is saying is true. They don't get one. Not this time, anyway.

Sometimes Jesus does miracles to jolt his listeners into faith. Matthew, Mark and Luke all report Jesus' healing of a paralyzed man, whose friends lower him from the roof to Jesus' feet. Jesus forgives the man his sins, much to the injury of the religious scruples of the scribes and Pharisees. Noticing their discomfort, Jesus says: "Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier: to say, 'Your sins are forgiven you,' or to say, 'Stand up and walk'? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the one who was paralyzed—"I say to you, stand up and take your stretcher and go to your home." Immediately he stood up before them, took what he had been lying on, and went to his home, glorifying God [Luke 5:22-25]. Pretty convincing, if you ask me!

Jesus does the same thing at the raising of Lazarus. Just after the stone is rolled away from the tomb entrance and before he calls Lazarus to life, Jesus prays: "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." [John 11:41-

42]. Lazarus walks out of his tomb and, doubtless, many are brought to faith.

It's enough to wonder why everything Jesus teaches isn't proven by a miracle. Why do the crowds in Luke 5 and John 11 benefit from a miracle but the folks in John 6 don't? I think the answer has something to do with the trustworthiness of Jesus whether a miracle happens or doesn't. And maybe more miracles happen than we always recognize.

As I write, we've only had 6 days of 100+ weather in July. Is it miraculous? Does it affect if or how we believe in Jesus? It's good to wonder about these things now and then. On what do we base our faith? What assures us of who we are to God? I think signs and wonders are all around us, each illustrating God's great love for us. But if there weren't a single one, would there still be enough to convince you? Give it some thought; and, while you're at it, stay cool!

....In July we sent \$1,000 to Lutheran World Relief focused on help for Texas and Louisiana floods.

....in April we sent \$1,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response for Southern California fires.

....in February we sent \$500 to Lutheran Social Services.

....We sponsored two children (\$500 each) for school in El Salvador

....We used fourteen Action cards (\$250 each). Thanks to Diane Durando, Connie Phillips, Elaine Shoemaker, Charlotte Fountinelle, Sharon Rowley, Sandra Trippel, Laurell Huber, Diane Ellis, Phyllis Lea, Wanda and Judy Friesen, and Margie Back.


