As we enter August already – where has the summer gone? – we have some great opportunities for fellowship and learning. Opportunities to

“S'more Love”, our Vacation Bible School for all ages, begins Wednesday, August 6 and goes for 4 weeks from 5:30-7:30 p.m. I look forward to our time together as we learn about God's love for us and spend time together across the generations.

South Milwaukee Community Night Out is August 6. We had a lot of fun engaging with the wider community at our table last year. The event is from 5:30-9:30 p.m., and we need a few volunteers to staff the Trinity table and meet people from our South Milwaukee community.

Also in August we have a great opportunity to have fellowship and worship with our partner Lutheran Church of the Great Spirit. On August 17 at 10 a.m., we are invited to worship in the park with LCGS. The location is yet to be determined. We will have our regular 9:30 a.m. worship here at Trinity, and then I hope you will join us afterwards at the park for worship, food and fellowship. Watch for more details.

On August 23/24, we welcome Pastor Chris Manke, the director of Outreach for Hope, to worship. He will preach and I will lead the service. Outreach for Hope does an amazing ministry in the Greater Milwaukee Synod, making a huge impact on the ministry of churches serving in urban areas of our synod. A walking team is also getting organized for the September 27 Ride/Walk/Run event. Lidia Amonson is organizing our team – thank you, Lidia!

And last, but certainly not least, this year for God's Work Our Hands Sunday and Rally Day, September 7, we welcome Bishop Paul Erickson who will preach and preside at Holy Communion, while I lead the rest of the service. After worship, he will give us a presentation on Global Refuge (formerly Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service) and how the ministry is adapting with the new immigration reality in our country. As our bishop, he serves on their Board of Directors. Following his presentation, we will go to fellowship hall for lunch and then we will assemble Health and Wellness kits and Community Garden kits for Global Refuge to distribute in their ministry. 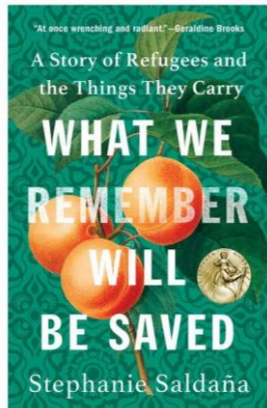

Fall Book Read



With so much in the news about refugees, migration and immigration we will be reading “What We Remember Will Be Saved: A Story of Refugees and the Things They Carry.” Join us on **Saturday, October 11, 2025 at 9:30 a.m.** at Castillo’s Family Restaurant (5656 S Packard Ave, Ste 21, Cudahy) for breakfast and discussion of this book. Eggplant seeds, a lullaby in a vanishing language, an embroidered dress. When people flee their homes, the things they save speak of beauty and suffering and the indomitable human spirit.

In an era of mass migration in which more than 100 million people are displaced comes this lyrical portrait of Syrian and Iraqi refugees and the belongings they carry.

What We Remember Will Be Saved is a book of hope, home, and the stories we hold within us when everything else has been lost.

Journalist and scholar Stephanie Saldaña, who lived in Syria before the war, sets out on a journey across nine countries to meet refugees and learn what they salvaged from the ruins when they escaped. Now, in the narratives of six extraordinary women and men, from Mt. Sinjar to Aleppo to Lesbos to Amsterdam, we discover that the little things matter a great deal. Saldaña introduces us to a woman who saved her city in a dress, a musician who saved his stories in songs, and a couple who rebuilt their destroyed pharmacy even as the city around them fell apart. Together they provide a window into a religiously diverse corner of the Middle East on the edge of unraveling, and the people keeping it alive with their stories.

Born of years of friendship and reporting, What We Remember Will Be Saved is a breathtaking, elegiac odyssey into the heart of the largest refugee crisis in modern history. It reminds us that refugees are storytellers and speakers of vanishing languages, and of how much history can be distilled into a piece of fabric, or eggplant seeds. What we salvage tells our story. What we remember will be saved.

Civic Life and Faith Study

A 6-week Study on Civic Life and Faith led by Pastor Denise will begin **October 8, 2025** and be held on **Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.** at Trinity.

At the 2025 Churchwide Assembly, the ELCA adopted a social statement on Faith and Civic Life. Join Pastor Denise for this 6-week study exploring this statement and what it might look like to engage in civic life as a Christian and as a Lutheran. The six sessions are:

- Session 1: “How Is God’s Invitation to Discipleship Lived Out in a Democracy?”
- Session 2: “How Do Christians Address Controversial Civic Issues?”
- Session 3: “What Are Lutheran Views on Civic Life?”
- Session 4: “What Are the Objectives of Democracy in the United States?”
- Session 5: “What’s Faith-based Living Got to Do with Civic Life?”
- Session 6: “How Do We Go in Peace to Love and Serve the Lord in Civic Life?”

The sessions will be a combination of videos and conversation using the participant guides. Participant guides will be provided. Please sign up or let Pastor Denise know you will attend so that we can have a participant guide ready for you.

South Milwaukee Community Night Out

On August 6, the South Milwaukee Police Department is hosting “Community Night Out.” Trinity will have an information table at Community Night Out again this year. This entire event, which aims to bring the community together and foster positive relationships with our local police department, is a testament to God’s active presence in the world. There is the potential, then, for Trinity to be renewed in mission, faith, and relationships with the community as we share our story and God’s story with the broader community. He will be joining us for worship on **Sept. 6/7**, and after worship, he will give a presentation on the work of Global Refuge and

how it has been affected by federal cuts in refugee services. After the presentation, we will go to Fellowship Hall for lunch. Trinity will provide Cousin's Subs through a Thrivent Grant – please bring sides to go with the subs. After lunch, we will make two types of Neighbor Kits for Global Refuge. Below are the items needed for each kit. We will collect your donations for these kits in August, and then the Thrivent Member Group will supplement the items so we have complete kits to assemble and send to Global Refuge. If you have any questions, contact Pastor Denise.

Garden kits support the refugee-focused community garden in Fargo, North Dakota. Items needed:

- plastic retail bags or 3 gallon zipper bags to hold the kit items
- gardening gloves
- gardening apron
- kneeling pads
- sun hat
- sunscreen
- (optional items include twine, reusable produce bag, reusable grocery bag)

- toothbrush
- toothpaste
- bar soap
- travel size or small shampoo
- deodorant
- feminine hygiene products
- (optional items include hand sanitizer, lotion, umbrella)

Financial Update for June

June was another somewhat normal summer month with a small deficit, thanks to a five-weekend month and Reserve Money Market CD interest.

1. Net income for June was -\$1,289; Year-to-Date income is -\$7,932.
2. We had to borrow another \$5,000 from the reserve to cover the checking account balance.
3. Compared to last year at this time, we are up \$1,000 in gifting.

Thank you, Trinity, for your year-round support of our operating budget through your generous gifts. Please keep in mind that when considering your regular gifting routine, most of our expenses remain relatively consistent throughout the year.

Project Uplift: balance of \$28,247, income of \$296, and expense of \$1,780 for partial back door ADA mechanism replacement.
