For several years, Northgate Church has led a Christian worship service at Nautical Days on the Sunday morning. This year, Nautical Days would like the Sunday morning to more directly reflect the diversity of the Comox Valley, so the Comox Valley Multi Faith Group has been invited to coordinate the time and has come up with a new idea.

Everyone is invited to come to Marina Park this Sunday August 3rd after worship and meet some of the religious and spiritual communities active in the

Comox Valley. There will be a chance to meet and chat with folks from different communities, some of whom you may not even know are here! We ask that all come in the spirit of connection and curiosity seeking to find common ground and perhaps learn something new.

The event will run from 10:30am – 12 noon. We will still worship at Comox United at our regular time, but after the service, Rev. Karen will be heading down to the Marina, and invites everyone to come as well.

We'll be setting up a space, and we have been encouraged to bring clothes, images, objects, brochures, and pamphlets that represent our religious/spiritual affiliations and practices. There will also be a conversation space set up with conversation starters.

We will need some volunteers to set up our space at 9 am, and some people to staff the table from 10:30 to 12 (yes, you'd have to miss church that morning), as well as takedown and clean up at 12 noon.

On August 17, stay after church to hear about the experiences of Rev. Keith Simmonds

On Sunday, August 17, Rev. Keith Simmonds, who is currently serving at Campbell River United, will be leading us in worship. Keith tells us, "My partner Laurel Walton and I were married at Comox United, and our son Liam was baptised there too. Some folk might remember us."

In 2020, Keith served as a Human Rights Witness in Bethlehem after being commissioned by the World Council of Churches, and he observed and reported on the Occupation of Palestine by Israel.

After our worship service, Keith would like to share some of the stories of the people he met (Jewish Israeli and Palestinian) and the events he witnessed. Attempting to grow understanding and foster commitment for change, he knows we can bring about peace in our time. Come find out how!

Apology to 2S and LGBTQIA+ Communities next Friday morning

During the 45th General Council next week in Calgary, the United Church of Canada will offer an historic apology for ways in which the denomination has hurt and harmed 2S and LGBTQIA+ communities within and beyond the United



Church. The apology will take place in the context of a special livestreamed worship service at Knox United Church in Calgary **next Friday**, **Aug 8 at 8 am PT** (that's the morning, not evening).
