New ELCA Bishop Elected

The Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected to serve a 6-year term as presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly being held July 28–Aug. 2 at the Phoenix (Ariz.) Convention Center.

Speaking to the assembly after his election, Curry reflected on his membership at Shekinah Chapel in Riverdale, III., where he eventually became a lay mission developer while he participated in the Theological Education for Emerging Ministries program, which prepares individuals for ordained ministry in the ELCA.

Curry has served as bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019. He previously served as mission developer (2009-2012) and pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah Chapel.

He received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill., in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013.

READINGS FOR THE DAY:

Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23: The teacher of wisdom who wrote Ecclesiastes sees that working for mere accumulation of wealth turns life into an empty game, a 'vanity of vanities.' Nevertheless, he asserts in the next verse, it is good to find enjoyment in one's work because such enjoyment is a gift from God.

<u>Colossians 3:1-11:</u> Life in Christ includes a radical reorientation of our values. Just as the newly baptized shed their old clothes and put on new garments, so Christians are called to let go of greed and take hold of a life shaped by God's love in Christ.

<u>Luke 12:13-21:</u> In God's reign, the 'rich will be sent away empty.' Jesus uses a parable to warn against identifying the worth of one's life with the value of one's possessions rather than one's relationship with God.
