## Key Takeaways:

## Discussion Questions:

1. What stood out to you most from the sermon? Why?
2. The sermon mentioned various translations of "chesed" (love, mercy, kindness, etc.). How does this multifaceted understanding of God's love impact your view of His character?
3. Reflect on the story of God's covenant with Abraham (Genesis 15). How does this demonstrate God's commitment to His promises?
