To God Be the Glory: A Hymn of Jubilee and Revival

Among the many beloved hymns sung across United Methodist congregations, To God Be the Glory holds a cherished place. With its triumphant melody and resounding message of praise, this hymn has encouraged generations to lift their voices in thanksgiving for the wondrous works of God through Christ. But like many hymns, its journey to prominence has an unexpected and inspiring history.

The hymn was penned by the prolific English writer Fanny J. Crosby in the 19th century, with music composed by William H. Doane. Crosby, who was blind from a young age, became one of the most influential hymn writers in American history, composing over 8,000 hymns during her lifetime. Her deep spirituality and poetic gift shaped the way countless Christians experienced worship, and To God Be the Glory stands as one of her most enduring collaborations with Doane.

Interestingly, despite Crosby and Doane's success, To God Be the Glory was largely forgotten for many decades. First published around 1875, the hymn was included in a small number of gospel collections but never achieved widespread use in the United States during their lifetimes. It wasn't until the mid-20th century that the hymn was brought back into the spotlight in a remarkable way.

Evangelist Billy Graham, during his revival campaigns in the 1950s, reintroduced the hymn to America after it had gained popularity in Great Britain. Reports say that Graham included the hymn in a 1954 London Crusade, where the congregation responded with overwhelming enthusiasm. Upon returning to the States, Graham began to use it frequently in his crusade services. From that point on, To God Be the Glory took its place among the most beloved hymns in modern Christian worship.

The message of To God Be the Glory is deeply rooted in the gospel: God's great love revealed in Christ, the promise of redemption through faith, and the call to rejoice in His glory. The refrain — 'Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, let the earth hear His voice!' — captures both a personal response to salvation and a communal call to worship, something Methodist hymnody has long embraced.

In United Methodist worship, this hymn is often used to mark celebratory moments: anniversaries, dedications, and times of spiritual renewal. It reminds the church that praise is central to our identity and mission. Whether sung in a traditional sanctuary or a contemporary gathering, its joyful declaration continues to bring believers together in gratitude and awe.

To God Be the Glory stands not just as a musical treasure, but as a testimony to the enduring power of hymnody to revive hearts and rekindle faith. From a modest beginning in Crosby's pen to global recognition through contemporary worship, it calls us to remember that, above all, we sing not for our glory, but for God's.

Peach Cobbler

Ingredients

- 1½ cups self rising flour
- 1 stick Butter
- ½ cup water
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- · 4 cups peaches, peeled and sliced
- 1 cup milk
- ground cinnamon, optional

Directions

- Preheat oven to 350 °F.
- Combine the peaches, 1 cup sugar, and water in a saucepan and mix well. Bring to a boil and simmer for 10 minutes. Remove from the heat.
- Put the butter in a 3-quart baking dish and place in oven to melt.
- Mix remaining 1 cup sugar, flour, and milk slowly to prevent clumping. Pour mixture over melted butter. **Do not stir.**
- Spoon fruit on top, gently pouring in syrup. Sprinkle top with ground cinnamon, if using.
- Batter will rise to top during baking. Bake for 30 to 45 minutes.
- To serve, scoop onto a plate and serve with your choice of whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.
