	 Jesus uses two different Greek words here for life. The first one is the Greek New Testament word [ψυχή, pusche] in the first two words translated as life. It is were we get our English word psyche, psychology. This refers to the life of the, which is our will, our emotions and our soul which is physical. The 2nd word translated as "life" is the Greek New Testament word [ζωή, Zoe]. This refers to the eternal divine life.
