

Sermon Notes: "The Lost Art of Listening"

John 4:1-38

8.3.25

The Key Principle: Understanding Prevents Misunderstanding

The Master Class on Listening:

- A. Jesus Started with Felt Needs, Not Theology or the Dirty Laundry (v. 7)
- B. Jesus Asked Questions That <u>Drew</u> Her Out (vv. 9-12)
- C. Jesus Listened to Deeper Needs Before Addressing Them (vv. 15-18)
- D. Jesus Saw the Harvest That Others Missed (vv. 34-38)

So What?

The 80/20 Rule for Listening:

• In any spiritual conversation, aim to listen 80% and talk 20%. Your <u>ears</u> might be more evangelistic than your <u>mouth</u>.

Two Types of Listening:

- 1. Surface Listening
- 2. Soul Listening

BLESS Framework:

- B Begin with Prayer
- L Listen with <u>Care</u> (This week)
- E Eat Together
- S Serve in Love
- S Share Your Story

Evangelism isn't about having all the <u>answers</u> - it's about asking the right <u>questions</u>.

For Study, Reflection, Discussion:

- 1. Review the sermon notes from Sunday. Was there a particular point that stuck with you? What was it and why did it resonate with you?
- 2. Darin mentioned that "even hearing aids wouldn't help we hear fine, but our 'listener' got broken." *Be honest:* What usually happens when someone shares something important with you? Are you listening to understand, or listening to respond?

READ: John 4:1-38

- 3. In John 4, Jesus had every reason to avoid the woman at the well, but He chose to listen first. Think of someone in your life who's easy to avoid or judge. What would it look like to approach them the way Jesus approached her?
- 4. The sermon talked about friends who don't believe people you golf with, whose kids play with your kids, etc. You know WHAT they believe about God, but do you know WHY? What makes it scary to have that deeper conversation with a close friend?
- 5. Think about a recent conversation you had. Did it stay at surface level ('How's work?' 'Fine.') or go to soul level? What would it look like to practice soul listening with someone on your prayer list this week?
- 6. Jesus said 'the fields are ripe for harvest' there's no off-season. Who is someone you've been thinking 'isn't ready yet' to hear about Jesus? What if they're more ready than you think, and they just need someone to listen to their story first?

Specific Action Step:

This week: This week, choose ONE person from your prayer list and have ONE genuine conversation using the 80/20 rule. Your goal isn't to share the gospel - it's to learn something new about their life, dreams, or struggles. Come prepared next week to share (without using names) what you discovered when you truly listened.
